

HAN REFUGEES: A POTENTIAL HEADACHE	
Refugee migration to urban areas in Pakistancombined with the substantial sums of money some of them bringare causing sharp increases in urban rents and land prices, according to a variety of reports. Although migration has alleviated local labor shortages in the past, it is now creating labor surpluses that are depressing wages in some areas. Refugees are opening numerous small businesses, and in Quetta, Baluchistan, they dominate industries such as trucking, and sandal and shoe manufacturing.


