SUBJECT: Draft Amendment to the FY 1985 Intelligence
Authorization Bill


By Office of Legislative Liaison letter of March 30,
the views of the Department of Defense were sought on a
proposed amendment to subject bill that would,

1. Require that numbers, status, privileges and
immunities, etc., within the U.S. of official representatives
of foreign governments that engage in intelligence activities
within the U.S. harmful to the national security should not
exceed the same number, etc., within such countries of
official representatives of the U.S.

2. Require that the number of foreign diplomats in the
U.S. granted diplomatic immunity not exceed the number of
U.S. nationals granted similar status within the country of
any foreign government determined by the President to be
engaged in intelligence activities within the U.S. harmful
to the national security of the U.S.

3. Strike a requirement restricting the Director of
the Office of Foreign Missions to an individual with 10 years
as a member of the Foreign Service and other related
qualifications.

The Department of Defense concurs in the proposed amendment
to the FY 1985 Intelligence Authorization Bill.
