IN SEARCH OF EXCELLENCE 16 MARCH 1984

A FEW WEEKS AGO I SPOKE TO YOU IN THIS SAME AUDITORIUM AND ASKED FOR YOUR HELP IN UNLEASHING A PROCESS TO GET FROM EVERY CORNER OF OUR ORGANIZATION A BROAD EXAMINATION OF WHAT WE ARE ABOUT. AND WHAT WE WANT TO FOSTER AND ENCOURAGE. I ASKED YOU TO DEVELOP A CONCISE STATEMENT OF GOALS. PRINCIPLES AND STANDARDS OF EXCELLENCE THAT WOULD BOTH REFLECT WHAT MAKES CIA GREAT AND SERVE AS A CONTINUING CHALLENGE TO US NOT TO REST ON OUR LAURELS. BUT TO CONSTANTLY STRIVE FOR SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE AND EXCELLENCE. TO GIVE YOU A STRAWMAN. I PROVIDED A ROUGH DRAFT OF WHAT SUCH A STATEMENT MIGHT CONTAIN. I ALSO ASKED FOR ANY OTHER IDEAS OR SUGGESTIONS THAT ANYONE MIGHT HAVE FOR FOSTERING AN ATMOSPHERE OF CREATIVITY AND A BIAS TOWARD ACTION. I DIDN'T WANT TO NAME A HUNDRED PEOPLE OR A DOZEN TASK FORCES TO WORK MANY MONTHS IN ORDER TO PRODUCE HUNDREDS IF NOT THOUSANDS OF PAGES OF ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATIONS AS SO MANY ORGANIZATIONS HAVE DONE. INSTEAD I WANTED TO INVOLVE ALL OF YOU IN EXAMINING AND DISCUSSING OUR MISSION AND HOW WE COULD DO IT BETTER AND HAVE YOU GIVE ME YOUR IDEAS IN THREE WEEKS.

I'M VERY PLEASED ...

I'M VERY PLEASED TO REPORT THAT AS USUAL. YOU CAME THROUGH WITH FLYING COLORS. ON FEBRUARY 24TH I RETURNED FROM A TRIP ABROAD AND FOUND 34 INCHES OF THOUGHTFUL RESPONSES WAITING FOR I HAD A HEAVY COLD AND STAYED IN BED FOR THE WEEKEND. THAT ENABLED ME TO READ ALL OF YOUR DRAFT STATEMENTS AND ADDITIONAL IDEAS AND SUGGESTIONS. I MADE 12 PAGES OF NOTES ON YOUR SUGGESTIONS AND MY REACTION TO THEM. COPIES OF THOSE NOTES WERE SENT TO THE 663 OF YOU WHOSE NAMES APPEARED ON THE SUBMISSIONS I RECEIVED. I KNOW THAT MANY TIMES THAT NUMBER PARTICIPATED IN THE DIALOGUE THAT GENERATED THOSE IDEAS AND SUGGESTIONS.

I HAVE TO ADMIT THAT YOUR CRITICISM OF MY DRAFT WAS GOOD FOR MY SOUL. IF I HAD KNOWN THAT IT WOULD BE SCRUTINIZED SO THOROUGHLY, I MIGHT HAVE SPENT MORE TIME ON IT. AS I'VE MENTIONED TO SOME OF YOU. THE UNKINDEST CUT OF ALL WAS. "IT SORT OF RESEMBLES A GOVERNMENT REGULATION." THE BEST COMMENT ANYONE COULD MUSTER WAS THAT IT WAS A RESPECTABLE FIRST TRY!

MANY OF YOU DID NOT MINCE ANY WORDS. AND I APPRECIATED THAT CANDOR. I UNDERSTAND SOME INITIAL HESITANCY GAVE WAY TO STIMULATING DISCUSSIONS AT ALL LEVELS OF THE ORGANIZATION. WANT THAT DIALOGUE TO CONTINUE.

YOUR RESPONSES REFLECTED...

YOUR RESPONSES REFLECTED A STRONG UNDERCURRENT OF IDEALISM AND A DESIRE TO ATTAIN EXCELLENCE. YOU HAD MANY GOOD THOUGHTS ABOUT WHAT WE DO BEST. WHERE WE NEED TO DO BETTER. AND HOW WE CAN DO THAT.

SEVERAL COMMON THEMES EMERGED:

- --You have a strong sense of pride in yourselves. In your work, and in CIA.
 - --YOU DO HAVE A STRONG BIAS FOR ACTION AND
- --YOU WORRY THAT CREEPING BUREAUCRACY MAY BE STARTING TO TAKE A SIGNIFICANT TOLL ON OUR SPIRIT AND ON OUR ABILITY TO GET THINGS DONE.
- --IT CAME THROUGH LOUD AND CLEAR TO ME THAT YOU HAVE A CLEAR CONCEPT OF WHAT WE'RE ABOUT AND THAT WHILE YOU WANTED A CLEAR AND CONCISE ENUNCIATION OF OUR GOALS AND IDEALS YOU ALSO LOOKED FOR FOLLOW THROUGH ACTION.

WHAT I WANT TO DO TODAY IS LET YOU KNOW WHAT WE PLAN TO DO TO FOLLOW UP ON YOUR IDEAS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

TO ESTABLISH A FRAMEWORK ...

TO ESTABLISH A FRAMEWORK FOR OUR EFFORTS. I HAVE SYNTHESIZED YOUR SUGGESTIONS FOR A STATEMENT OF PURPOSE INTO A CIA CREED. I BELIEVE THIS IS SOMETHING WE CAN ADHERE TO AND POINT TO WITH PRIDE WHEN ANYONE ASKS US WHAT THE CIA IS ALL ABOUT. AS YOU WILL SEE, IT SAYS THINGS LIKE:

- -- WE PRODUCE TIMELY AND HIGH QUALITY INTELLIGENCE FOR THE PRESIDENT AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES.
- -- WE PROVIDE OBJECTIVE AND UNBIASED EVALUATIONS AND ARE ALWAYS OPEN TO NEW PERCEPTIONS AND READY TO CHALLENGE CONVENTIONAL WISDOM.
- -- WE PERFORM SPECIAL INTELLIGENCE TASKS AT THE REQUEST OF THE PRESIDENT.
- -- WE CONDUCT OUR ACTIVITIES AND OURSELVES ACCORDING TO THE HIGHEST STANDARDS OF INTEGRITY. MORALITY AND HONOR AND ACCORDING TO THE SPIRIT AND LETTER OF THE LAW.

WE BELIEVE OUR PEOPLE ...

- -- WE BELIEVE OUR PEOPLE ARE THE AGENCY'S MOST IMPORTANT RESOURCE. WE SEEK THE BEST AND WORK TO MAKE THEM BETTER.
- -- WE EXPECT OUR LEADERS TO DEMONSTRATE INITIATIVE. A COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE. AND A PROPENSITY FOR ACTION: TO REWARD AND PROTECT US IN A MANNER WHICH REFLECTS THE SPECIAL NATURE OF OUR RESPONSIBILITY. OUR CONTRIBUTION. AND OUR SACRIFICES: AND TO PROMOTE AMONG US A SENSE OF MUTUAL TRUST AND SHARED RESPONSIBILITY.
- -- WE DERIVE OUR INSPIRATION AND COMMITMENT TO

 EXCELLENCE FROM THE INSCRIPTION IN OUR FOYER:

 "AND YE SHALL KNOW THE TRUTH AND THE TRUTH SHALL
 MAKE YOU FREE."

TO CAPTURE ALL THE VALUABLE IDEAS AND SUGGESTIONS PRODUCED IN THIS EXERCISE. I CONVENED AN INTERDIRECTORATE TASK FORCE TO PULL TOGETHER A STATEMENT OF OUR MISSION AND GOALS TO SUPPLEMENT THIS CREED. WE'LL SEE THAT THIS IS WIDELY DISTRIBUTED. ALONG WITH THE CREED.

THIS GROUP ALSO CULLED....

THIS GROUP ALSO CULLED THROUGH YOUR IDEAS TO IDENTIFY WHAT WE COULD IMPLEMENT RIGHT AWAY. I MET WITH THE TASK FORCE LAST WEEK AND AGREED WITH THE VAST MAJORITY OF THEIR SUGGESTIONS.

IT IS IMPORTANT FOR YOU TO KNOW THAT THIS EFFORT IS GOING TO LEAD TO CHANGES OF ATTITUDE AND POLICY ON THE PART OF SENIOR MANAGEMENT AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A NUMBER OF SPECIFIC STEPS THROUGHOUT THE AGENCY THAT ARE RESPONSIVE TO YOUR CONCERNS AND ASPIRATIONS.

FIRST. LET ME NOTE SOME BROAD CHANGES IN DIRECTION WHICH YOUR SENIOR MANAGEMENT UNANIMOUSLY SUPPORTS:

--WE WILL PUSH DOWN AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITY TO THE LOWEST LEVEL OF MANAGEMENT POSSIBLE. DECISIONS AND ACTIONS THAT CAN BE TAKEN AT THE BRANCH. OFFICE. OR DIVISION LEVEL WILL BE DELEGATED TO THAT LEVEL.

--WE WILL UNDERTAKE A MAJOR EFFORT TO INCREASE RECOGNITION OF OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE. BECAUSE WE CANNOT TOUT OUR SUCCESSES TO THE OUTSIDE. WE MUST RECOGNIZE EXCELLENCE AND EXPRESS APPRECIATION FOR PERFORMANCE MORE BROADLY INSIDE.

WE WILL GIVE RENEWED ...

- --WE WILL GIVE RENEWED EMPHASIS TO IMPROVED COMMUNICATIONS. MANAGERS TOO OFTEN ARE TOO REMOTE. WE WILL UNDERTAKE A NUMBER OF MEASURES TO IMPROVE COMMUNICATIONS IN BOTH DIRECTIONS.
- --WE WILL DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO MAINTAIN THE UNIQUENESS OF CIA AND ITS PEOPLE AND TO ENSURE THAT THE SPECIAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND BURDENS THAT OUR PEOPLE MUST BEAR ARE MATCHED BY COMMENSURATE BENEFITS AND SPECIAL TREATMENT.
- --WE ARE GOING TO REVERSE THE TREND TOWARD MORE BUREAUCRACY AND MORE REGULATION.

THERE ARE A NUMBER OF SPECIFIC ACTIONS THAT YOU HAVE SUGGESTED THAT BRING THESE GENERAL NOTIONS TO LIFE. I HAVE CHARGED EACH DEPUTY DIRECTOR TO DEVELOP SPECIFIC MEASURES TO IMPLEMENT THESE GENERAL POLICIES. Some of the MEASURES CAN BE IMPLEMENTED IMMEDIATELY: OTHERS MAY TAKE A LITTLE TIME. BUT

THERE ARE A NUMBER OF ...

THERE ARE A NUMBER OF THINGS THAT YOU RECOMMENDED IN YOUR DISCUSSIONS THAT WE CAN IMPLEMENT ON AN AGENCY-WIDE BASIS NOW. HERE ARE JUST SOME OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS YOU HAVE MADE THAT I HAVE DIRECTED TO BE CARRIED OUT EFFECTIVE NOW:

--WE WILL BEGIN DELEGATING AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES BY

- --DELEGATING ASSIGNMENTS OF SIS-1s AND 2s to THE DEPUTY DIRECTORS.
- --WE WILL DELEGATE AUTHORITY TO APPROVE AWARDS UP TO THE CAREER INTELLIGENCE MEDAL TO THE HEADS OF THE CAREER SERVICES.
- --WE WILL ALSO DELEGATE APPROVAL OF CASH AWARDS UP TO \$1.000 TO THE CAREER SERVICE HEADS.
- --WE WILL DELEGATE CONTROL OF FTE. FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT. TO OFFICE HEADS.

--WE ARE LOOKING AT ALL OF OUR ADMINISTRATIVE PRACTICES TO DETERMINE WHERE WE CAN STREAMLINE OUR PROCEDURES AND REDUCE THE BURDEN OF PAPERWORK.

- --WE WILL MAKE ANNUAL WORK PLANS OPTIONAL. DEPENDING ON THE MUTUAL DESIRES OF SUPERVISORS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES.
- --WE WILL ELIMINATE THE REQUIREMENT FOR SEPARATE DOCUMENTATION FOR PROMOTION RECOMMENDATIONS.
- --WE WILL SIMPLIFY THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES OF OUR OFFICE OF TRAINING AND EDUCATION FOR EXTERNAL TRAINING.
- --In the communications arena. I am sending all Agency managers a letter letting them know that our pursuit of excellence depends on their personal commitment to communicate our goals and standards of excellence to all our employees. I expect them to practice "Management by Walking Around" -- to be visible. To foster sensible risktaking, creativity, and innovation; to be open to your ideas and recognize your contributions.
 - --WE WILL GET MORE NEWS OUT THROUGH OUR ELECTRONIC MAIL SYSTEM. WHICH IS OPERASTED BY THE OFFICE OF DATA PROCESSING AND KNOWN AS AIM. AUTOMATIC INFORMATION MANAGEMENT..
 - --EACH DIRECTORATE WILL DEVELOP ITS OWN "TRENDS AND HIGHLIGHTS" PROGRAM THAT WILL BE OPEN TO ALL AGENCY EMPLOYEES.

- --THE OFFICE OF PERSONNEL WILL PROVIDE PERIODIC BRIEFINGS OPEN TO ALL EMPLOYEES ON THE STATUS OF BENEFITS AND OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST.
- --FEEDBACK FROM INSPECTOR GENERAL SURVEYS WILL BE SHARED AND EMPLOYEES WILL BE INVOLVED IN SOLVING THE PROBLEMS THAT ARE CITED.
- --OFFICE OF MEDICAL SERVICES WILL CONDUCT HEALTH FAIRS AND PUBLISH A HEALTH NEWSLETTER.
- --MANY OF YOU VOICED CONCERN THAT THE ONLY VISIBILITY THE PUBLIC HAS INTO CIA IS THROUGH THE MEDIA. WHICH IS OFTEN SLANTED OR INCORRECT.
- --To counter that, John McMahon, Myself, and other senior officers will selectively speak to responsible, influential groups to educate the public about this institution's vital contribution to our national security and foreign policy. This will not be a public relations campaign. It is simply an acknowledgment that the understanding and support of the American public are necessary if we are to successfully perform our mission. Many of your responses made it clear that you would like your senior officials to stand up for our mission

AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS. AND WE INTEND TO DO THAT. I HAVE ALREADY SCHEDULED TALKS OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS IN SEATTLE. SAN FRANCISCO. LOS ANGELES AND HOUSTON.

- --REALIZING THAT THE QUALITY OF YOUR WORK ENVIRONMENT IMPACTS ON WHAT YOU PRODUCE. WE ARE BEGINNING A CONCERTED EFFORT TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE AROUND HERE. I RECENTLY SIGNED A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE ADMINISTRATOR OF GSA THAT DELEGATES TO US AUTHORITY TO MAINTAIN OUR OWN BUILDING. IF YOU WANT TO SEE WHAT A DIFFERENCE THAT WILL MAKE. I SUGGEST YOU VISIT NPIC. AS I DID RECENTLY. AND SEE THE TRANSFORMATION THAT HAS TAKEN PLACE OVER THERE.
- --WE ARE UPGRADING OUR CURRENT PHYSICAL FITNESS FACILITY AND PLAN TO INCORPORATE ANOTHER ONE INTO THE NEW BUILDING.
- --FINALLY. WE ARE MOVING OUT ON THE PERSONNEL AND TRAINING FRONTS TO MAKE SURE WE GET THE FIRST RATE PEOPLE WE NEED AND KEEP THEM ONCE THEY ARE HERE.
 - --OUR RECRUITERS' FULL COURT PRESS FOR CAREER TRAINEES SO FAR THIS YEAR HAS ALREADY ALMOST DOUBLED THE NUMBER WE TOOK IN ALL LAST YEAR.

- TOP FLIGHT SCHOOLS LIKE STANFORD AND MIT HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL. OVERALL. WE HAVE MORE APPLICANTS IN PROCESS AT THIS TIME THAN WE HAVE EVER HAD IN OUR HISTORY.
- --WE WILL DEVELOP A BASIC INTRODUCTION FOR ALL THESE NEW EMPLOYEES SO THAT THEY CAN APPRECIATE THE MISSION. GOALS. WORK ETHIC AND CULTURE OF CIA.
- --WE WILL WAIVE TIME-IN-GRADE GUIDELINES FOR PROMOTIONS TO REWARD EXCELLENCE IN PERFORMANCE.
- --WE WILL LOOK FOR MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR DUAL CAREER TRACKS. SO THAT SPECIALISTS WILL BE PROMOTED FOR THEIR EXPERTISE WITHOUT HAVING TO TAKE ON MANAGERIAL RESPONSIBILITIES.
- --WE WILL ELIMINATE THE 8-hour donation rule for overtime.
- --WE WILL PROVIDE TEMPORARY CLEARANCES TO SPOUSES ACCOMPANYING EMPLOYEES OVERSEAS SO THAT THEY CAN TAKE PART IN SELECTED BRIEFINGS AND TRAINING COURSES PRIOR TO THEIR DEPARTURE.
- --WE INTEND TO PROVIDE SOME FORM OF ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION FOR ALL OF OUR EMPLOYEES WHILE THEY ARE SERVING OVERSEAS.

- --SPECIAL PAY SCALES WILL BE DEVELOPED FOR HIGH TECHNOLOGY JOBS AND OTHER CRITICAL SKILL JOB CATEGORIES.
- --I SHARE YOUR CONFUSION OVER THE USE OF THE TERMS PROFESSIONAL. CLERICAL AND TECHNICAL IN AN ORGANIZATION WHERE ALL EMPLOYEES PRIDE THEMSELVES ON THEIR PROFESSIONALISM. So. WE INTEND TO ABOLISH THOSE LABELS AND RECOGNIZE ALL EMPLOYEES AS PROFESSIONALS.
- --WE WILL TAKE A CAREFUL LOOK AT THE IMPACT OF TECHNOLOGY ON OUR PEOPLE, THEIR JOBS, AND OUR OFFICE ENVIRONMENT.
- --We're asking the Office of Personnel to consider possibilities for a phased retirement program -- this is an idea the private sector is toying with to permit people to drop back to part-time work and phase out gradually rather than completely. As we traditionally do now.
- --MEANWHILE. WE ARE CAREFULLY FOLLOWING SEVERAL NEW PROPOSED LEGISLATIVE CHANGES IN GOVERNMENT RETIREMENT PROGRAMS. BOB MAGEE. WITH THE HELP OF OUTSIDE CONSULTANTS. HAS A CADRE OF PEOPLE WORKING FULL-TIME TO DEVELOP CIA RETIREMENT OPTIONS FOR MY CONSIDERATION. AND FOR THE FIRST

TIME, WITHIN THE OFFICE ...

TIME. WITHIN THE OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE LIAISON. WE HAVE A SENIOR OFFICER WHOSE EXCLUSIVE DUTY IS TO FOLLOW GOVERNMENT PERSONNEL PROGRAMS THAT MIGHT AFFECT OUR EMPLOYEES AS THEY DEVELOP ON CAPITOL HILL.

--Our purpose is to achieve continued Congressional Recognition of the Agency's unique retirement needs. We have discussed this at the highest levels within the Administration and on the Hill. Where we have the strong support of our two Oversight Committees. I believe we will be able to satisfy the special retirement needs of the CIA and its employees.

THIS LAST POINT REMINDS ME OF ANOTHER COMMON THEME IN YOUR RESPONSES--PRIDE IN "THE UNIQUENESS OF CIA." I WOULD LIKE TO DIGRESS ON THAT FOR A MOMENT. I WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT IN THE THREE YEARS WE HAVE WORKED TOGETHER. I HAVE COME TO APPRECIATE THAT YOU ARE INDEED A SPECIAL GROUP OF PEOPLE. IN MY VISITS TO AGENCY INSTALLATIONS. WHETHER OVERSEAS OR HERE. I AM ALWAYS

IMPRESSED BY THE HIGH CALIBRE OF OUR PEOPLE. I HEAR THE SAME THING FROM CONGRESSMEN AND SENATORS WHO HAVE VISITED OUR PEOPLE OVERSEAS OR WHO HAVE BEEN BRIEFED BY THEM HERE ON A WIDE RANGE OF COMPLEX ISSUES.

IN ORDER TO WORK HERE, YOU HAD TO SURVIVE ONE OF THE MOST RIGOROUS SCREENING PROCESSES KNOWN TO MAN -- THE HIGHEST SKILL REQUIREMENTS, PSYCHOLOGICAL TESTING, MEDICAL CLEARANCES.

SECURITY CLEARANCES, POLYGRAPHS. OUT OF AN ANNUAL AVERAGE OF 153,000 INQUIRIES OVER RECENT YEARS, WE INTERVIEW ONLY 23,000 APPLICANTS. OF THOSE, 10,000 ARE ACTIVELY CONSIDERED BY COMPONENTS. ONLY 4,000 ARE PUT IN PROCESS, AND OF THOSE, 1,500 MAKE IT THROUGH THE ENTIRE SCREENING PROCESS AND ENTER ON DUTY. AFTER YOU HAVE EMERGED FROM THAT FUNNEL, THEN YOU UNDERGO A 3-YEAR PROBATIONARY PERIOD. ONCE YOU ATTAIN CAREER STATUS, YOU AND YOUR FAMILIES LIVE WITH ANY NUMBER OF CONSTRAINTS -- SECURITY RESPONSIBILITIES, PREPUBLICATION REVIEW REQUIREMENTS; ALMOST HALF OF YOU BEAR THE BURDENS IMPOSED BY COVER. WITH ALL OF THIS, YOU ARE THE PEOPLE POLICYMAKERS TURN TO WHEN THEY NEED SOMETHING DONE WELL AND FAST. LAST YEAR YOU

FORFEITED 97,000 HOURS ...

FORFEITED 97.000 HOURS OF ANNUAL LEAVE AND WORKED UNTOLD HOURS OF UNCOMPENSATED OVERTIME. YOU WON'T FIND THAT AT YOUR ORDINARY GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY. YOU ENJOY NO PUBLIC RECOGNITION FOR YOUR ACHIEVEMENTS AND MUST TOLERATE CRITICISMS - RESPONSIBLE OR OTHERWISE - IN SILENCE.

I KNOW AND APPRECIATE ALL THAT. SO DOES THE PRESIDENT.

AND SO DO OUR CONGRESSIONAL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEES. CONGRESS. IN 1947. ANTICIPATED THE SPECIAL NEEDS OF CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY EMPLOYEES AND PROVIDED THE DIRECTOR WITH CERTAIN SPECIAL AUTHORITIES. WHILE THESE AUTHORITIES CANNOT BE USED IMPRUDENTLY. I HAVE EXERCISED AND WILL CONTINUE TO EXERCISE THEM WHEN THE NEEDS OF THE AGENCY CLEARLY JUSTIFY DOING SO.

ONE FINAL NOTE ON OUR FOLLOW-THROUGH ON YOUR SUGGESTIONS. I WANT TO EMPHASIZE THAT THIS IS ONLY THE BEGINNING. WE'VE ASKED THE DEPUTIES TO USE WHATEVER MECHANISM THEY WANT -- MAG GROUPS. OFFICE-LEVEL TASK FORCES. WHAT HAVE YOU -- TO CONTINUE TO PERIODICALLY GENERATE IDEAS TO IMPROVE THE WAY WE GO ABOUT OUR BUSINESS. WE BELIEVE OUR WORK DURING THESE LAST SIX WEEKS ONLY SCRATCHED THE SURFACE AND WE WANT TO TAP DEEPER INTO THE WEALTH OF IDEAS OUT THERE.

I WANT TO THANK YOU ...

I WANT TO THANK YOU AGAIN FOR THE TIME AND EFFORT YOU PUT INTO THIS EXERCISE. IT WILL CONTINUE TO BE AN ONGOING PROCESS -- THE PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE AND EVER INCREASING EFFECTIVENESS IN CARRYING OUT OUR NOBLE MISSION IS SOMETHING WE ALL MUST STRIVE FOR TOGETHER.

REMARKS OF WILLIAM J. CASEY

CIA AUDITORIUM 24 JANUARY 1984 As we start our fourth year of working together, I want you to know that it's been a rich and gratifying experience for me and I want to thank all here for what we have been able to do together. At the same time I want to tell you about some discussions and events during the first weeks of this year which brought home to me how much more there is to do.

WEEK BEFORE LAST I PREPARED A RATHER DETAILED REPORT ON WHAT WE'VE BEEN ABLE TO ACCOMPLISH OVER THE LAST THREE YEARS AND REVIEWED IT WITH THE PRESIDENT. MORE THAN ANY OTHER PART OF THE GOVERNMENT WE ARE IN ACTION EVERY DAY, DEALING WITH THE WORLDWIDE APPARATUS OF THE KGB, PLUS SOME 70 NON-GOVERNING COMMUNIST PARTIES, PLUS PEACE AND FRIENDSHIP ORGANIZATIONS ALL OVER THE WORLD DIRECTED FROM MOSCOW, PLUS THE EAST GERMAN, CUBAN, AND OTHER BLOC INTELLIGENCE SERVICES—ALL WORKING TO STEAL OUR TECHNOLOGY, TO DAMAGE OUR REPUTATION, TO DIVIDE US FROM OUR FRIENDS, TO DESTABILIZE, SUBVERT AND OVERTHROW GOVERNMENTS FRIENDLY TO US.

THE PRESIDENT KNOWS THAT CIA IS THE ORGANIZATION IN THE FREE WORLD MOST CAPABLE OF DEALING EFFECTIVELY WITH THIS ENORMOUS APPARATUS AND FRUSTRATING ITS OBJECTIVES. I WAS ABLE TO SPELL OUT FOR HIM HOW IN THESE THREE YEARS, ALMOST FROM SCRATCH, WE HAVE CREATED NEW CAPABILITIES FOR DEALING WITH WORLD PROBLEMS. I REVIEWED HOW, IN RECENT MONTHS, WE HAVE THWARTED TERRORIST ATTACKS, RECOVERED STOLEN TECHNOLOGY AND CARRIED OUT RESCUE OPERATIONS IN MANY PARTS OF THE WORLD.

IN THE INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY AND IN CIA THE PRODUCTION AND QUALITY OF FINISHED INTELLIGENCE FOR POLICYMAKERS IS AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL IN HISTORY. FROM A LOW POINT IN 1980 OF ONLY 12 NATIONAL ESTIMATES, IN 1983 WE PUBLISHED SOME 50 NATIONAL ESTIMATES AS WELL AS 25 OTHER INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY ASSESSMENTS. IN ADDITION, WE COMPLETED MORE THAN 800 RESEARCH PROJECTS ON A NEARLY INCONCEIVABLE RANGE OF SUBJECTS FROM SOVIET WEAPONS SYSTEMS TO POPULATION PROBLEMS TO THE IMPLICATIONS OF INTERNATIONAL DEBT. THIS WAS IN ADDITION TO OUR STREAM OF PERIODICALS—DAILIES, WEEKLIES, MONTHLIES AND QUARTERLIES.

I WAS ABLE TO TELL THE PRESIDENT HOW OUR DIRECTORATE OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY HAS COME UP WITH A WHOLE RANGE OF IMPROVED METHODS OF ACQUIRING AND ANALYZING INFORMATION. I WAS ABLE TO SPELL OUT HOW, IN 1983, THE KGB HAS TAKEN THE WORST SHELLACKING IN ITS HISTORY AS 117 SOVIET INTELLIGENCE AGENTS DEFECTED OR WERE EXPELLED FROM OVER 20 COUNTRIES ON ALL CONTINENTS.

IT TOOK ME 20 SINGLE-SPACED PAGES TO SUMMARIZE FOR THE PRESIDENT WHAT WE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED OVER THESE THREE YEARS.

I HAVE NO INTENTION OF TAKING YOU THROUGH ALL OF THAT TODAY.

BUT I DO WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT THE PRESIDENT REACTED STRONGLY WITH PRIDE AND APPRECIATION IN WHAT YOU HAVE DONE IN REBUILDING AND REVITALIZING THE NATION'S INTELLIGENCE ARM AND EXTENDS HIS APPRECIATION AND CONGRATULATIONS.

THIS WEEK, WITH OUR NATIONAL INTELLIGENCE OFFICERS, I AM PUTTING THE FINISHING TOUCHES ON THE WORLDWIDE BRIEFING WHICH WE GIVE TO SIX COMMITTEES OF THE CONGRESS AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH SESSION. TOMORROW, IN THE FIRST OF THESE BRIEFINGS, WE WILL TELL THE SENATE ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE ABOUT THE LARGE NUMBER OF NEW STRATEGIC WEAPONS WHICH THE SOVIETS HAVE UNDER DEVELOPMENT TO THREATEN US-HEAVY MISSILES, MOBILE MISSILES, CRUISE MISSILES LAUNCHED FROM NEW SUBMARINES AND NEW AIRPLANES. WE WILL TELL THEM ABOUT NEW CONVENTIONAL WEAPON SYSTEMS TO BE DEPLOYED TO SUPPORT A DOCTRINE OF HIGHLY MOBILE MANEUVER FORCES SUPPORTED BY MASSIVE ARTILLERY FIRE AND TACTICAL AIR STRIKES. WE WILL TELL THEM ABOUT THE WORLDWIDE OCEAN EXERCISE LAST

WE WILL SPELL OUT HOW THE GLOBAL REACH OF THE SOVIET UNION HAS EXPANDED OVER THE LAST TEN YEARS SO THAT SOVIET FORCES NOW OPERATE FROM FULL-FLEDGED BASES IN CUBA, VIETNAM, SYRIA, SOUTH YEMEN, ETHIOPIA, LIBYA, ANGOLA, AND OVER A DOZEN ADDITIONAL COUNTRIES ALLOWING MORE LIMITED ACCESS. A SOVIET MILITARY PRESENCE IS NOW ESTABLISHED IN EVERY MAJOR REGION OF THE WORLD.

WE WILL SPELL OUT HOW COMMUNIST AND RADICAL ARAB STATES USE DOZENS OF MAJOR TERRORIST ORGANIZATIONS, SCORES OF TERRORIST TRAINING CAMPS AND A WIDE ARRAY OF AD HOC TERRORIST GROUPS AND LIBERATION MOVEMENTS TO THREATEN AND ATTACK OUR PEOPLE, DISRUPT THE PEACE AND INFLAME RACIAL, RELIGIOUS AND OTHER CONFLICTS AROUND THE WORLD. PREPARING THESE BRIEFINGS BRINGS HOME VIVIDLY

THE TREMENDOUS RESPONSIBILITY WE HAVE TO KEEP TRACK OF, TO UNDERSTAND AND TO WARN ABOUT THE EVOLUTION OF AN AWESOME ARRAY OF SOPHISTICATED NEW WEAPONS SYSTEMS, OF NEW MILITARY DOCTRINES AND STRATEGIES, OF THE RISE AND FALL OF NATIONAL ECONOMIES, OF POTENTIAL INSTABILITIES AND CHANGES OF DIRECTION IN COUNTRIES ON WHICH WE DEPEND, OF NEW TECHNOLOGIES WHICH AFFECT BOTH OUR SECURITY AND OUR PROSPERITY, OF THE POLITICAL DRIVE IN EUROPE TO BREAK UP THE WESTERN ALLIANCE, OF THE RACE FOR SUPREMACY IN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY. THIS IS THE STUFF OF EVERYDAY LIFE IN THIS ORGANIZATION. MEETING THE CHALLENGE OF DEALING WITH THIS PANORAMA OF FAST MOVING EVENTS BOTH DEMANDS AND BRINGS OUT THE BEST IN ALL OF US.

THE FIRST WEEK OF THE YEAR WE PUT THE FINISHING TOUCHES ON OUR BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 1985. THE PRESIDENT AND THE CONGRESS HAVE BEEN GENEROUS IN GIVING US THE RESOURCES TO BUILD AND IMPROVE OUR CAPABILITY TO MEET THESE CHALLENGES. WE ARE WELL ON THE WAY TO RECOVERING THE GROUND LOST DURING THE 70s. By 1986 WE WILL BE EXAMINING THE WORLD MUCH MORE CLOSELY AND WITH NEW TECHNICAL MARVELS COLLECTING INFORMATION WHICH WE DO NOT NOW REACH. TO HANDLE THIS GREATLY EXPANDED FLOW OF DATA, GET IT WHERE IT IS NEEDED, SORT IT OUT AND FIGURE OUT WHAT IT MEANS, WE ARE MODERNIZING OUR COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK, DEVELOPING NEW COMPUTER SYSTEMS AND OTHER ADVANCED METHODS OF MANAGING AND TARGETING THESE COLLECTION SYSTEMS AND PROCESSING AND ANALYZING THE DATA THEY WILL PRODUCE.

SUBSTANTIALLY. OUR ANALYSTS WILL BEAR THE BRUNT OF COPING WITH A SHARPLY INCREASED VOLUME OF INFORMATION. IN THE LAST THREE YEARS THE BUDGET OF THE DIRECTORATE OF INTELLIGENCE HAS INCREASED BY ALMOST 50 PERCENT AND BY THE END OF THIS YEAR WE WILL HAVE ADDED MANY NEW ANALYSTS TO THE ROSTER. RESOURCES FOR OUTSIDE EXPERTISE TO HELP AND CRITIQUE OUR ANALYSIS HAVE ALMOST TRIPLED. WE HAVE CONDUCTED A MASSIVE CAMPAIGN TO PUT OUR ANALYSTS IN TOUCH WITH EXPERTS IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR, UNIVERSITIES, THINK TANKS, PRIVATE BUSINESS HERE AND ABROAD. WE HAVE MOVED ANALYSTS INTO THE COMPUTER AGE WITH HUNDREDS OF THEM NOW HAVING A TERMINAL TO BRING NEW REPORTS TO THEIR DESK EVERY DAY, ORGANIZE THEIR DATA AND BRING IT BACK AS NEEDED. ONLY WITH IMPROVED METHODS WILL THE SAME NUMBER OF ANALYSTS CIA HAD IN 1960 BE ABLE TO COPE WITH THE FAR BROADER PROBLEMS OF THE 1990s.

IT SAYS A LOT ABOUT THE IMPROVED PUBLIC ATTITUDE TOWARD THE CIA THAT LAST YEAR ABOUT A QUARTER OF A MILLION AMERICANS ASKED ABOUT SIGNING UP WITH THE CIA. FEWER THAN ONE PERCENT WERE HIRED. THAT'S VERY TIGHT SCREENING AND SELECTION. TO COPE WITH THIS INCREASED HIRING, TO DEVELOP NEW SKILLS AND HELP ALL OF US DO BETTER AND MORE RELEVANT WORK, OUR TRAINING CAPABILITIES HAVE BEEN EXPANDED AND IMPROVED WITH NEW COURSES AND PROGRAMS. THIS SPRING WE WILL BREAK GROUND FOR A NEW BUILDING ON THIS CAMPUS WHICH WILL GIVE US MORE THAN AN ADDITIONAL MILLION SQUARE FEET OF SPACE AND GREATLY IMPROVE THE EFFICIENCY WITH WHICH WE WILL BE ABLE TO DO OUR WORK.

ALL OF US CAN TAKE PRIDE IN WHAT WE HAVE UNDER WAY, AND HOW WE HAVE USED THE RESOURCES THAT HAVE BEEN PROVIDED US.
BY 1986 WE WILL HAVE COMPLETED MOST OF THE BUILDUP PROJECTED THREE YEARS AGO. BUT THE PROBLEMS WILL BE GREATER AND MORE COMPLEX. THE AMOUNT OF DATA BEING COLLECTED WILL THREATEN TO INUNDATE US. WE WILL BE ABLE TO STAY ON TOP OF IT AND MEET OUR RESPONSIBILITIES ONLY BY HIGHER QUALITY PERFORMANCE. WE ARE WELL INTO THE PROCESS OF RESTORING OURSELVES QUANTITATIVELY.

OUR THRUST FOR THIS YEAR AND BEYOND MUST BE TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF OUR SKILLS, OF OUR PERFORMANCE AND OF THE SERVICE WE PROVIDE OUR CUSTOMERS.

WE START WITH WHAT IS PROBABLY THE MOST PROFESSIONAL AND DEDICATED WORK FORCE IN THE US GOVERNMENT. WE HAVE TRADITIONALLY MAINTAINED A POSITION ON THE LEADING EDGE OF TECHNICAL ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE COLLECTION AND HANDLING OF INFORMATION. THE QUALITY OF OUR ANALYSIS IN MANY AREAS SURPASSES THAT PRODUCED ANYWHERE ELSE IN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT—OR, FOR THAT MATTER, IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR. WE NEED TO CONTINUE TO ATTRACT AND RETAIN SOME OF THE BEST MINDS AVAILABLE IN ANALYTICAL, OPERATIONAL, TECHNICAL AND SUPPORT SPECIALTIES. WE NEED TO RECRUIT YOUNG PEOPLE WITH BRAINS, CREATIVITY, DEDICATION AND DRIVE. WHAT WE HAVE TO OFFER THEM IS THE OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN AN ORGANIZATION UNIQUE IN THE CHALLENGES IT FACES, IN THE RESPONSIBILITY IT CARRIES, IN THE SPIRIT AND THE CAN—DO QUALITIES IT MANIFESTS. EVERY ONE OF US SHOULD MAKE IT PART OF OUR RESPONSIBILITY TO BE ALERT TO PEOPLE

WHO CAN MEET OUR STANDARDS, TO CONVEY THE MESSAGE THAT THERE IS A SPECIAL PRIVILEGE AND A SPECIAL SATISFACTION IN OUR WORK AND DO EVERYTHING WE CAN TO PROVIDE THE EXAMPLE, THE LEADERSHIP, THE GUIDANCE AND THE OPPORTUNITY TO HELP NEW RECRUITS DEVELOP AS WE WOULD LIKE THEM TO.

CIA MUST HAVE DONE THIS WELL OVER THE YEARS. LET US NOW

FOCUS MORE CONSCIOUSLY ON DOING IT BETTER AND MORE COMPREHENSIVELY.

WE ARE CONSTANTLY FACING THE LOSS OF PROVEN EXPERIENCE AND

ABILITY THROUGH RETIREMENTS. WE WILL HAVE TO FILL THAT GAP FROM

BELOW AND THE RAPID ACCUMULATION OF NEW THREATS, PROBLEMS, AND

CONCERNS FOR US TO HANDLE PROVIDES THE OPPORTUNITY AND THE

PRESSURE TO BRING OUR NEW RECRUITS AND YOUNGER PEOPLE ALONG

RAPIDLY TO BOTH HIGHER RESPONSIBILITY AND BETTER PERFORMANCE.

WE MUST REMEMBER THAT WHEN THE SPIRIT AND ATTITUDES WE CHERISH HERE WERE DEVELOPED CIA WAS A MUCH SMALLER GROUP OF PEOPLE, MANY OF WHOM KNEW EACH OTHER AND HAD WORKED TOGETHER BEFORE. WE NOW HAVE MORE NEW PEOPLE THAN WE'VE HAD IN A VERY LONG TIME. WE NEED TO TAKE SPECIAL CARE THAT WE PRESERVE, TRANSMIT AND RENEW THE QUALITIES WHICH HAVE BEEN INSTILLED HERE OVER 37 YEARS.

GOOD AS WE ARE, THESE NEW CHALLENGES DEMAND THAT WE WORK

TO IMPROVE OUR PERFORMANCE. How DO YOU GET SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE

FROM A VERY LARGE ORGANIZATION? It'S NOT COMMON AND IT'S NOT

How do they do it year after year? Much the same qualities run through these enterprises engaged in broad spectrum of diverse activities. There is a bias for action, the closest attention to serving the customer, encouraging entrepreneurship in the organization, looking to the rank and file as the root source of quality in performance, fostering leadership and innovation at all levels, practical risk-taking, lean staffs, lots of small task forces to tackle specific problems in a short time frame, a high premium on flexibility, on rapid and effective learning, on adaptation and commitment. In a variety of ways they encourage initiative, support self-starters, create task forces with short time fuses to react quickly, break new ground, cross fertilize experience and knowledge. They push their managers and star performers to lead and develop younger people by force of example, to identify their comers and to force the pace of their development.

WE HAVE IN CIA MANY OF THE FEATURES THAT CHARACTERIZE THESE HIGH-POWERED PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS. WHEN WE AWARDED THE PERFORMANCE BONUSES HERE LAST WEEK TO SENIOR MANAGERS, WE RECOGNIZED INDIVIDUALS WHO CARRY THE PRINCIPAL RESPONSIBILITY IN OUR GOVERNMENT FOR ASSESSING THE SOVIET STRATEGIC THREAT, FOR COPING WITH THE SOVIET-CUBAN SUBVERSIVE THRUST IN THE CARIBBEAN AND CENTRAL AMERICA, FOR MODERNIZING OUR WORLDWIDE SUPPORT SYSTEMS FOR WATCHING SOVIET VIOLATIONS OF ARMS CONTROL AGREEMENTS AND OTHER SPLENDID ACHIEVEMENTS. WE ARE MOVING YOUNGER PEOPLE INTO GREATER RESPONSIBILITY AS OFFICE DIRECTORS AND HEADS OF MAJOR OPERATIONS OF WORLDWIDE IMPORTANCE. WE HAVE MID-LEVEL officers briefing the President and working on task forces TACKLING HIGH NATIONAL CONCERNS ABOUT INSURGENCIES, ABOUT TERRORISM, ABOUT DECEPTION AND DAMAGE TO OUR INTELLIGENCE CAPABILITIES, ABOUT THE STABILITY OF MAJOR COUNTRIES IN WHICH WE HAVE BIG STAKES. WHERE ELSE CAN YOUNG PEOPLE GET THAT KIND OF A CHALLENGE?

Those who will be our future middle and senior level managers will also be judged on their record in identifying and developing talent as well as on their own performance. The process of making assignments—deciding how much and what kind of expertise must be focused on the various tasks which confront us, and deciding to whom to entrust these tasks—is of critical importance. Some assignments stretch the capabilities of our people—sometimes setting the stage for great growth. Other assignments merely

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF WHAT A PERSON ALREADY KNOWS HOW TO DO. AS YOU CARRY OUT THIS ESSENTIAL TASK, CONSIDER THE PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT ASPECTS OF EACH ASSIGNMENT AS CAREFULLY AS YOU DO THE NEED TO ACCOMPLISH SUCCESSFULLY WHATEVER TASK IS AT HAND.

YOU WILL FIND OTHER WAYS TO FOSTER AN ATMOSPHERE OF CHALLENGE AND OPPORTUNITY, TO TEST OUR YOUNGER PEOPLE, TO BRING THEM MORE RAPIDLY INTO HIGHER AND BROADER RESPONSIBILITY, AND TO INSTILL IN THEM A SENSE OF PURPOSE AND A CONFIDENCE IN THEIR CAPABILITIES.

IT ALL BOILS DOWN TO A QUEST FOR EXCELLENCE. THAT IS AND ALWAYS HAS BEEN ALIVE AND WELL IN THIS ORGANIZATION. HOW CAN WE INTENSIFY AND TRANSMIT THAT ASPIRATION TO EVERY CORNER OF THIS ORGANIZATION AND BRING OUT LATENT TALENT WHEREVER IT EXISTS. WEEK BEFORE LAST, AFTER A DAY VISITING A LEADING CORPORATE RESEARCH CENTER, I CAME AWAY WITH NEW INSIGHT INTO HOW QUALITIES OF THRUST AND DRIVE, FLEXIBILITY AND RESPONSE TO CHALLENGE AND THE QUEST FOR EXCELLENCE CAN BE MADE TO PERVADE AND ANIMATE A HUGE ORGANIZATION. A MAJOR KEY TO ITS SUCCESS IN MAINTAINING HIGH PERFORMANCE, FOCUS AND DRIVE IN A LARGE NUMBER OF COMPONENT ORGANIZATIONS SPREAD ALL OVER THE WORLD IS A STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES AND PRINCIPLES WHICH THEY TAKE VERY SERIOUSLY. WE HERE AND OTHERS IN GOVERNMENT HAVE A CODE OF CONDUCT WHICH PRIMARILY TELLS US WHAT NOT TO DO. THAT IS IMPORTANT AND MUST NOT BE NEGLECTED. BUT WE ALSO NEED TO HAVE EVER IN OUR MINDS A CALL TO ACTION, A STATEMENT OF POSITIVE PURPOSE, AN ARTICULATION OF STANDARDS OF EXCELLENCE TO WHICH WE CAN RALLY AND ASPIRE.

THE TONE AND ATTITUDE AT CIA IS RIGHT BUT I BELIEVE AN ARTICULATION OF OUR POSITIVE OBJECTIVES CAN INTENSIFY THE EXCELLENCE WE HAVE ACHIEVED HERE AND SPREAD IT MORE BROADLY.

I'VE COLLECTED FROM A NUMBER OF CORPORATE STAR PERFORMERS

STATEMENTS OF THEIR OBJECTIVES WHICH THEY RELY ON TO GIVE THEIR PEOPLE THE FREEDOM AND RESPONSIBILITY TO WORK TOWARD THOSE STATED GOALS IN WAYS THEY FIND BEST IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY.

HOW DO WE GET SUCH A STATEMENT OF PURPOSE, AN ARTICULATION OF STANDARDS OF EXCELLENCE FOR THIS ORGANIZATION IN A WAY WHICH DEVELOPS FROM WITHIN AND REFLECTS THE VIEWS, ASPIRATIONS AND THE EXPERIENCE OF ALL OUR PEOPLE AND, ABOVE ALL, WHICH HAS THEIR COMMITMENT. IN THE THREE YEARS I'VE BEEN HERE, I'VE VISITED MANY OF OUR PEOPLE OVERSEAS AND HAVE VISITED MOST ELEMENTS OF THE ORGANIZATION HERE IN THE CAPITAL AREA. I DO AS MUCH OF THIS AS I CAN FIND TIME FOR BECAUSE I ALWAYS LEARN AND FEEL BETTER ABOUT THIS OUTFIT FROM TALKING WITH YOU ONE ON ONE OR IN SMALL GROUPS. RECENTLY, I REALIZED THAT I NEEDED MORE CONTACT WITH THE MANY SUBSTANTIVE COMMITTEES WE HAVE IN THE COMMUNITY AND THOSE WE HAVE IN THE CIA. SO I WROTE TO THE CHAIRMAN OF EACH COMMITTEE ASKING FOR A THREE-PARAGRAPH NOTE TELLING ME (1) WHAT THE COMMITTEE WAS UP TO, (2) HOW WELL IT WAS DOING AND (3) HOW IT MIGHT DO BETTER. I RECEIVED GOOD RESPONSES QUICKLY AND THEY LED TO GOOD, PURPOSEFUL MEETINGS AND VALUABLE NEW PROJECTS FOR THE MORE ACTIVE COMMITTEES AND THE EXTINCTION OF SOME WHICH HAD SERVED THEIR PURPOSE.

WHAT I WANT TO DO NOW IS TO INSTITUTE A PROCESS TO GET WITHIN A SHORT TIME FRAME, FROM EVERY CORNER OF THE ORGANIZATION, A BROAD EXAMINATION OF WHAT WE ARE ABOUT, WHAT IT IS WE WANT TO FOSTER AND ENCOURAGE, AND THE KIND OF THINGS WE CAN DO TO ACCOMPLISH THAT. FROM THIS WE WILL DEVELOP A STATEMENT OF PURPOSE APPLICABLE TO THIS ORGANIZATION, TO OUR MISSION, TO THE KIND OF CUSTOMERS WE SERVE, AND TO THE KIND OF WORK ENVIRONMENT AND TASKS WHICH OUR MISSION REQUIRES. OUT OF THIS EXERCISE I BELIEVE WE CAN LEARN AND TEACH EACH OTHER A LOT. I WOULD LOOK FOR THE KIND OF POSITIVE STATEMENT OF PURPOSE AND STANDARDS OF EXCELLENCE WHICH WILL SUPPLEMENT THE CODE OF CONDUCT WHICH NOW TELLS US HOW WE MUST BEHAVE AND WHAT WE MUST NOT DO. OUT OF IT I BELIEVE WILL COME A HIGHER SENSITIVITY TO HOW WE CAN ENCOURAGE CREATIVITY, INDEPENDENCE OF ACTION, ENTREPRENEURSHIP, GET SMALL TASK FORCES ROLLING UP THEIR SLEEVES, TAKING ON A PROBLEM AND GETTING SOMETHING DONE WITHIN A RELATIVELY SHORT TIME FUSE. THAT'S THE WAY TO MAKE THINGS MOVE, TO GET SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE IN ANY ORGANIZATION--SET TASKS, SET DEADLINES, MAKE DECISIONS. ACT. STAY FLEXIBLE. CHANGE COURSE IF EXPERIENCE INDICATES. GET IT DONE AND MOVE ON. THAT'S THE TEMPO WE WANT AND NEED HERE.

How do we get this done? Some 15 years ago the State

Department, after a series of outside panels and commissions

created by Presidents, by Congress, some of them self-appointed,

had produced ponderous and unread reports, decided to examine

itself to see how it could do better. Two hundred and fifty

Foreign Service Officers deployed themselves into 13 separate TASK FORCES AND LABORED FOR 11 MONTHS TO PRODUCE THIS 600-PAGE VOLUME UNDER THE LABEL DIPLOMACY FOR THE SEVENTIES. IT IS COMMENDABLE THAT THE FOREIGN SERVICE APPLIED ITS OWN KNOWLEDGE AND EXPERIENCE TO DEFINE A NEW DIPLOMACY AND THIS WAS A GOOD EXERCISE FOR THE STATE DEPARTMENT. OUR STYLE IS DIFFERENT. I'M LOOKING FOR TWO PAGES IN THREE WEEKS PLUS ANY VALUABLE IDEAS AND SUGGESTIONS WHICH A QUICK AND SEARCHING SELF-EXAMINATION, INVOLVING NOT 250 PEOPLE BUT ALL OF US, CAN GENERATE. OUR STYLE IS TO LOOK FOR PROBLEMS AND NEEDS, TO SEARCH FOR AND MARSHAL THE EXPERIENCE AND TALENT TO RESPOND, GET IT DONE AND MOVE ON TO THE NEXT THING AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE. WE WANT TO EXTEND THAT SPIRIT, THAT STYLE, THAT TEMPO TO OUR NEW RECRUITS AND MORE WIDELY AMONG THOSE ALREADY HERE. WE'LL DO OUR SELF-EXAMINATION WITH A TASK FORCE. BUT IT WILL BE A BIG AND LOOSELY STRUCTURED TASK FORCE. IT WILL ENCOURAGE AND PROVIDE OPPORTUNITY FOR INDEPENDENT INITIATIVE AND THOUGHT FROM ALL LEVELS. IT WILL BE SHARPLY FOCUSED AND HAVE A SHORT TIME FUSE. EVERY MANAGER WILL RECEIVE A PACKAGE CONSISTING OF THREE PARTS: A ROUGH FIRST DRAFT OF A STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES AND PRINCIPLES FOR CIA, A SAMPLE OF COMPARABLE STATEMENTS FROM A FEW OTHER ORGANIZATIONS OF OUTSTANDING QUALITY, AND A QUICK SUMMARIZATION OF FEATURES AND METHODS THE AUTHORS OF THIS BOOK FOUND IN THE MOST EFFECTIVE PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS OUR COUNTRY HAS DEVELOPED. EACH MANAGER WILL BE EXPECTED TO USE HIS JUDGMENT ON HOW BEST TO GET THE PEOPLE HE WORKS WITH INVOLVED IN CRITIQUING AND IMPROVING THE DRAFT STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES AND GETTING

THEIR BROAD UNDERSTANDING, ACCEPTANCE AND COMMITMENT TO THOSE OBJECTIVES. I WOULD RECOMMEND WORKING IN SMALL GROUPS AND IN SHORT MEETINGS, BUT URGE THAT YOU FOLLOW YOUR OWN INSTINCTS AND DEVELOP YOUR OWN METHODS TO INVOLVE THE PEOPLE WHO WORK WITH YOU.

I WILL EXPECT EACH MANAGER TO HAVE BY 22 FEBRUARY AN IMPROVED STATEMENT OF GOALS FOR CIA AND A SUCCINCT MEMO SUMMARIZING THE IMPORTANT THOUGHTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS WHICH DEVELOPED IN THIS PROCESS AMONG THE PEOPLE WHO REPORT TO HIM. I WILL READ AND DISCUSS THESE RESPONSES CAREFULLY AND WE WILL PROMULGATE A STATEMENT OF OUR ORGANIZATIONAL OBJECTIVES BEFORE FEBRUARY IS GONE.
