SUBJECT: Secure Telephone Unit (STU-II) Program (U)

The protection of sensitive US Government telecommunications from the hostile intelligence threat remains a vital requirement of US national security. Development and implementation of the Secure Telephone Unit (STU-II) program is a key element in our effort to reduce the exploitation of sensitive communications. With deliveries of the first of the 5000 nationally funded STU-II units scheduled to begin in June 1984, large scale installation and upgrading of our existing secure voice network is imminent. (C)

Now is an appropriate time to accelerate the attainment of the President's telecommunications protection goal and expand the STU-II program to meet this goal. Each agency and department of the US Government shall identify its total secure voice telecommunication requirements and appropriate resources for additional STU-II procurement in its budgetary submission for FY 1986-1990. (C)

The Chairman, National Communications Security Committee shall oversee this effort and provide the necessary coordination among the departments and agencies in identifying and prioritizing US Government secure voice telecommunications security requirements. (C)
