On April 10, H. Res. 484, a resolution of inquiry concerning United States military involvement in hostilities in Central America was introduced in the House of Representatives and referred for appropriate action to the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence.

Under the Rules of the House, the Committee has fourteen legislative days beginning on April 10 to take action on the resolution. The Committee therefore requests that you provide to the Committee documents responding to the itemized particulars of the resolution by Friday, April 20 so that the Committee will be in a position to determine how to frame its recommendation on the resolution. Three copies of the resolution are enclosed herewith.

IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. Markey submitted the following resolution; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Foreign Affairs and the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence

RESOLUTION

Directing the President to furnish certain information to the House of Representatives concerning United States military involvement in hostilities in Central America.

- 1 Resolved, That within seven days after the adoption of
- 2 this resolution, the President shall furnish to the House of
- 3 Representatives the following:
- 4 (1) All documents in his possession concerning in-
- 5 stances of United States aircraft flying intelligence-
- 6 gathering missions in the airspace of El Salvador since
- 7 August 1, 1983, including any document showing the
- 8 time and frequency of such flights, the type of aircraft

involved, the missions performed, or the origin of such flights.

- (2) All documents in his possession indicating that intelligence gathered by United States Armed Forces has been supplied to the armed forces of El Salvador, Honduras, or Guatemala since August 1, 1983, including any document indicating that United States Armed Forces have provided tactical intelligence directly to elements of the armed forces of El Salvador while those Salvadoran forces were engaged in operations against insurgents.
- (3) All documents in his possession giving details of actual or proposed involvement by military or civilian agencies of the United States in combat missions in El Salvador or Honduras since August 1, 1983, including any documents discussing proposals by United States Government authorities to have aircraft owned by the United States Government, or manned by persons paid by the United States Government (including contract personnel), fly combat support missions against insurgents in El Salvador.
- (4) All documents in his possession discussing the possible involvement of United States Armed Forces in combat in Central America.

what is the border between Honduras and El Salvador which is recognized by the United States, all documents indicating how close to that border United States Armed Forces in Honduras may approach under the applicable rules of engagement, and all documents showing the number of times that members of the United States Armed Forces in Honduras have crossed that border.

(6) All documents in his possession showing that

- (6) All documents in his possession showing that United States Armed Forces deployed in Honduras have entered into the territory, airspace, or waters of El Salvador or Nicaragua since August 1, 1983, for any purpose other than transportation of such forces into or out of Honduras.
- (7) All documents in his possession discussing the purposes of Emergency Deployment Readiness Exercises on the Honduras-El Salvador border, the effects these exercises will have on the conflict within El Salvador, or whether these United States forces will be equipped for combat.
- (8) All documents in his possession discussing any instances in which United States Armed Forces in El Salvador or Honduras have come into contact with

1	forces hostile to the governments of those countries
2	since August 1, 1983.

- (9) All documents in his possession discussing any instances since August 1, 1983, in which members of the United States Armed Forces in El Salvador or Honduras either have been subject to hostile fire themselves or have been accompanying members of the armed forces of El Salvador who were subject to hostile fire.
- (10) All documents in his possession indicating that since August 1, 1983, United States Armed Forces have transported elements of Honduran or Salvadorn Armed Forces while these forces were engaged in operations against insurgents, including any document indicating that United States Armed Forces transported elements of Honduran Armed Forces in operations against insurgents in September 1983.
- (11) All documents in his possession discussing any instances in which United States Armed Forces in El Salvador or Honduras have come into contact with forces engaged in hostile action against the Government of Nicaragua since August 1, 1983.
- (12) All documents in his possession indicating that United States Government personnel (including contract personnel), or that vessels owned by the
