SAKHAROV HAS REPEATEDLY PROTESTED THE DETENTION OF HIS TWO COLLEAGUES, AND IN A GESTURE OF DEFIANCE, LAST MONTH FORMALLY INVITED THEM AMONG OTHERS TO THE OSLO NOBEL AWARD CEREMONY WHICH HE HIMSELF HAS BEEN PREVENTED FROM ATTENDING. BY HOLDING THE TRIALS OF THE TWO THIS WEEK, THE REGIME IS MAKING ITS OWN STRONG COUNTER-GESTURE TO -SAKHAROV AND HIS ALLIES AT HOME AND ABROAD.4


