In turn the Agency contacted Mr. Garfinkel, Director, Information Security Oversight Office, and brought the contents of the press release to his attention with a suggestion that he make an effort to determine whether classified information was included. Mr. Garfinkel contacted the University by telephone during which it was agreed that the University, would send him an index of the holdings.
