
Dear Bill:

On February 4, 1982, the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence received copies of the proposed Executive Order on National Security Information. The Committee is committed to expeditiously reviewing the contents of the new Order and forwarding its comments and observations to the Administration. Senator Goldwater has requested that the review of the Order be handled by the Subcommittee on Legislation and the Rights of Americans.

To better understand the differences between the proposed Order and E.O. 12065, the Subcommittee will conduct a briefing on the proposed Order prior to forwarding its comments to the Administration.
