




Who's Who In Lebanon

A Reference Aid (Based on information as of 31 October 1986)



The estimate of about 2.2 million applies to the 1984-85 period. Not considered in the estimate are expatriate Lebanese, foreign troops occupying the country, the nearly 400,000 Palestinians living in Lebanon, or war-related deaths. The estimates for total population and percentage compositions are predicated on assumptions concerning the confessional differences in fertility and emigration. Emigration of about 80,000 annually was greater than population gain through natural increase (births minus deaths) during the 1975-84 decade, thus the total population dropped during that period. This negative annual growth has probably




