Starr, Anderson to Write Special Weekly Columns

Two TRIBUNE correspondents based in the nation's capital will write special weekly columns for THE TRIBUNE's new daily Perspective page, which will appear beginning Monday.

Daily Perspective, a page of background and opinion on the news has been running in the Sunday TRIBUNE for the last year. Many new columnists, special writers, and cartoonists will be featured in the special page.

Appear Monday, Tuesday

Frank Starr, chief of the Washington Bureau of the Chicago Tribune Press Service, will write a column dealing primarily with international issues. William Anderson, national news correspondent, will offer his views on the national scene. Starr's column will appear each Monday, and Anderson's on Tuesdays.

Starr, 33, was appointed Washington Bureau chief on Jan. 1. He had been THE TRIBUNE's Moscow correspondent since 1957. In 1959, he won THE TRIBUNE's Edward Scott Beck award for his coverage of the fighting between the Soviet Union and Communist Chinese forces along China's northeast border.

Covers Entire Nation

Anderson, 44, named national news correspondent last October, had been city editor since

1957. He works out of Washington, but covers the entire country.

The new Perspective columnist has had extensive experience on the Washington politi-

cal scene. He first was a Washington correspondent for THE TRIBUNE in 1960, and covered the Pentagon and most of the early manned space flights.
