Anti-CIA Bulletin Points to Riots

The Covert Action Information Bulletin, formed by former CIA agent Philip Agee last year with the aim of "blowing the cover" of U.S. agents operating as diplomats abroad, has implied that the agency played a role in recent riots in Jamaica.

It also published the names of two alleged CIA agents operating there and said it had sent the names to "Struggle," a publication of the "Workers Party of Jamaica." Covert Action said it was "concerned with the spate of suspicious violence recently hitting Jamaica and with the coordinated right-wing attacks on the government of Prime Minister Michael Manley." It said the Jamaica violence was "reminiscent... of similar CIA destabilization activities in Chile."
