A new Voice of Moderation is born, and its postnatal yowl was a lusty smear. The danger from the Right, asserted, Dr. Franklin Littell, president of Iowa Wesleyan College and chairman for the new Institute for American Democracy, far exceeds that from the Left, because: "radical right groups . . . are in the vanguard of the biggest effort to brainwash a substantial portion of a population since Hitler's backers helped pave that paranoid's path to power with an aggressive propaganda campaign." Among the descendants of Goebbels specifically cited by Dr. Littell were Liberty Lobby, Americans for Constitutional Action, and the Church League of America. The IAD vows to battle extremism in every town council, school board and PTA. Its founders include: Dore Schary, of B'nai B'rith's Anti-Defamation League; UAW president Walter Reuther; Roy Wilkins of the NAACP; Ralph McGill, editor of the *Atlanta Constitution*; and Sens. Case (R., N.J.), McGee (D., Wyo.) and Moss (D., Utah).
