SUBJECT: "CIA" Highlighted in Houston News Story; Representative Archer Inquires

- 1. Phil Mosley of the staff of Representative Bill Archer (R., Texas) called on 28 February to ask about a 24 February Houston Post article reporting CIA participation in a visit by a group from the "U.S. War College" researching domestic urban issues to Houston on 23 February to investigate the Westheimer Independent School District breakaway controversy.
- office of Assistant to the Director, advised that a Houston radio station called him on 25 February about the same story, and he had alerted Harry Fitzwater, Director of Training.
- I called Mosley, who said that the breakaway controversy is a particularly sensitive local issue in Houston and that the news story has caused concern about possible Federal Government involvement in it, which is only heightened by the suggestion that the CIA might have a role. He added that the Congressional district is the one that George Bush used to represent, so everyone is particularly aware of the CIA.
- 4. I told Mosley that CIA officers routinely are included in classes of the National War College but do not publicize their affiliation. I assured him that the CIA itself had no interest whatsoever in the local controversy, and the reference must have been to a CIA officer who is only participating as a student in a routine War College activity. I
