Chinese Boomerang

The Chinese Communists recently attempted in Peking to make extensive propaganda use of American newsreels of race rioting in the Watts area of Los Angeles, and of draft-card burnings. The efforts boomeranged.

Wolf said he was told that films of the Watts riots were yanked out of circulation by the Chinese propagandists after audiences were found to be most impressed with how well-dressed the rioters were and how many automobiles were seen on the streets

What interested Chinese audiences most in the draft-card burning films were the cigarette lighters used to ignite the cards, Wolf said, "They cohed and aahed over them!"
