- 1. Thanks for your response to my request for concise information about what the committee is doing, how well it is doing, and how it might do better. I'm overwhelmed at the idea of reviewing 10,000 assigned priorities. How does this get done and how long does it take?

How do you go about "broadening community awareness of the priorities process and its potential impact on operation and resources management." I'd like to see what your story is to achieve this.
- 3. What kind of a staff does the committee have to handle the job of prioritization of intelligence topics.
