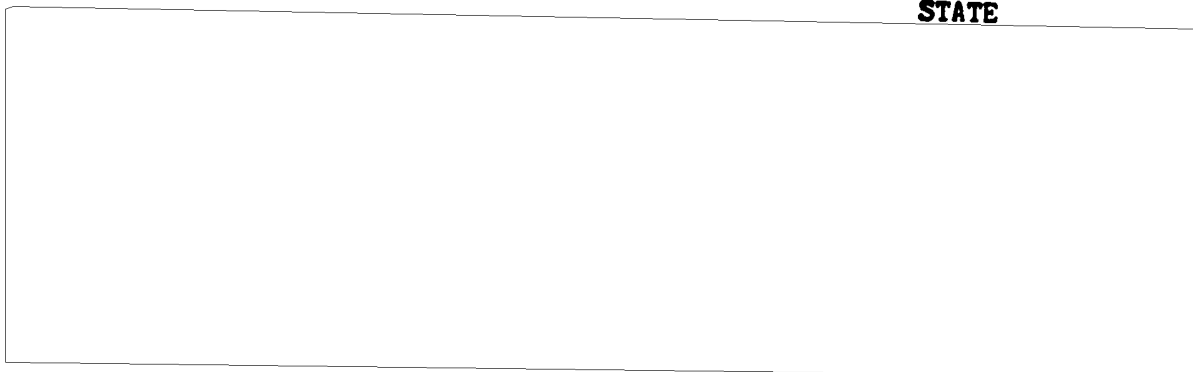

- 1. CONFIDENTIAL - ENTIRE TEXT.

2. SUMMARY. A U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP, THE NATIONAL RESOURCES DEFENSE COUNCIL, HAS NEGOTIATED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE USSR ACADEMY OF SCIENCES ON VERIFICATION OF SEISMOLOGICAL EVENTS WHICH THEY HOPE WILL DEMONSTRATE THE FEASIBILITY OF VERIFYING A TOTAL NUCLEAR TEST BAN. THEY HAVE ALSO WORKED OUT A PLAN FOR STATIONING U.S. SEISMOLOGICAL EQUIPMENT AT SITES IN THE USSR TO DETERMINE "BACKGROUND NOISE" AND SEISMOLOGICAL ATTENUATION RATES. COMPLETE TEXTS OF THE AGREEMENT FOLLOWS IN PARA FOUR. SOME MEMBERS OF THE GROUP APPEAR HOSTILE TO THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION AND MAY USE THE AGREEMENT TO ATTACK U.S. ARMS CONTROL POSITIONS. THE SOVIETS WILL PROBABLY ALSO SEEK TO SCORE PROPAGANDA POINTS WITH THE ACCORD.

3. REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES DEFENSE COUNCIL, A U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP, MET WITH SOVIET ACADEMY OF SCIENCES VICE PRESIDENT YEVGENIY VELIKHOV MAY 22-23 AND NEGOTIATED AN AGREEMENT TO SET UP "A JOINT STUDY OF SEISMIC EVENTS USING U.S.-MANUFACTURED HIGH ACCURACY INSTRUMENTS, IN PARTICULAR AROUND THE AREA OF THE TEST-SITE NEAR SEMIPALATINSK." THEIR GOAL IS TO DEMONSTRATE THE FEASIBILITY OF VERIFICATION OF A TEST-BAN TREATY. TEXT OF AGREEMENT FOLLOWS:

AGREEMENT

<> FROM THE 22ND TO THE 23RD OF MAY, 1986, SOVIET AND U.S. SCIENTISTS MET IN <><MOSCOW<><> TO DISCUSS INFORMALLY, A BROAD RANGE OF SCIENTIFIC PROBLEMS RELATED TO THE VERIFICATION OF A TEST BAN TREATY. THE MEETING WAS ATTENDED BY OBSERVER-SCIENTISTS FROM SWEDEN AND INDIA, WHO REPORTED ON THE TECHNICAL BASIS FOR THE OFFER BY THE FIVE CONTINENT PEACE INITIATIVE TO MONITOR A TESTING MORATORIUM. THE PARTICIPANTS AGREE THAT THE CURRENT STATE OF GEOPHYSICAL KNOWLEDGE GIVES REASONABLE CONFIDENCE IN THE DETECTABILITY, USING PRACTICAL SEISMIC NETWORKS, OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS TESTS DOWN TO YIELDS, AT, OR BELOW, ONE KILOTON. IN ORDER TO ENSURE AN EARLY START OF EFFORTS TO PERFECT SEISMIC TECHNIQUES, THE ACADEMY OF SCIENCES, USSR AND THE NATURAL RESOURCES DEFENSE COUNCIL, INC. AGREED TO LAUNCH, AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, A JOINT STUDY OF SEISMIC EVENTS USING U.S.-MANUFACTURED HIGH-ACCURACY INSTRUMENTS, IN PARTICULAR AROUND THE

GOVERNMENT AGREEMENT, MIGHT SERVE AS A MODEL FOR RESOLVING DIFFERENCES OVER THE VERIFICATION OF ARMS CONTROL TREATIES, PARTICULARLY THOSE LIMITING NUCLEAR EXPLOSIONS.

THE PROPOSAL WAS MADE IN AN AGREEMENT SIGNED HERE WEDNESDAY BY YEVGENY P. VELIKHOV, A VICE PRESIDENT OF THE ACADEMY OF SCIENCES, AND ADRIAN W. DEWIND, CHAIRMAN OF THE NATURAL RESOURCE DEFENSE COUNCIL, A PRIVATE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP BASED IN NEW YORK. THE PLAN CALLS FOR THE INSTALLATION, BEGINNING NEXT MONTH, OF THREE SEISMIC STATIONS IN THE SOVIET UNION TO MONITOR EXPLOSIONS IN THE NUCLEAR PROVING GROUNDS 90 MILES WEST OF SEMIPALATINSK, IN KAZAKHSTAN. THE STATIONS WOULD BE STAFFED BY AMERICANS.

UNDER THE PLAN, SOVIET SCIENTISTS, ALL OF WHOM WORK FOR THE GOVERNMENT, WOULD ESTABLISH SIMILAR STATIONS IN THE UNITED STATES TO MONITOR EXPLOSIONS AT THE NEVADA PROVING GROUND. THOMAS B. COCHRAN, A STAFF SCIENTIST OF THE AMERICAN GROUP, AND FRANK VON HIPPEL, A PROFESSOR OF PUBLIC AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS AT PRINCETON UNIVERSITY WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE NEGOTIATIONS HERE, SAID THE SOVIET MONITORING STATIONS COULD PROBABLY BE SET UP ON PRIVATE UNIVERSITY PROPERTY IN CALIFORNIA. DEWIND, WHO IS A NEW YORK LAWYER, SAID HE AND OTHER MEMBERS OF HIS GROUP HAD DISCUSSED THE PLAN INFORMALLY WITH THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION BEFORE COMING HERE. HE SAID THAT STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS, WHILE MAKING NO COMMITMENT TO GO ALONG WITH THE PLAN, HAD RAISED NO IMMEDIATE OBJECTION.

HE SAID HIS ORGANIZATION WOULD SEEK GOVERNMENT APPROVAL AS SOON AS THE NEGOTIATING TEAM RETURNS. IN WASHINGTON OFFICIALS SAID THEY WOULD WITHHOLD JUDGMENT ON THE PLAN. HOWEVER, THEY EXPRESSED WARINESS OVER AN ARRANGEMENT THAT WOULD HAVE SOVIET GOVERNMENT SCIENTISTS MONITOR TESTS IN THE UNITED STATES WHILE LIMITING AMERICAN PARTICIPATION TO PRIVATE CITIZENS.

DEWIND ADDED THAT THE PLAN WAS ALSO CONTINGENT ON THE ABILITY OF HIS GROUP TO OBTAIN PRIVATE FINANCING

INVITATION ON THE GROUND THAT THEY NEED TESTS FOR WEAPON MODERNIZATION. MIKHAIL S. GORBACHEV RECENTLY EXTENDED THE SOVIET TEST HALT UNTIL AUG. 6. THE NATURAL RESOURCE DEFENSE COUNCIL, FOUNDED IN 1970 BY 50 LAWYERS AND SCIENTISTS, NOW CLAIMS 62,000 MEMBERS WITH OFFICES IN NEW YORK, WASHINGTON AND SAN FRANCISCO. THE GROUP HAS ESPOUSED ARMS CONTROL, PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL CAUSES.
END TEXT.

THE GROUP TAKES EXCEPTION TO SEVERAL ASSERTIONS IN THE ARTICLE (WHICH ARE NOTED BELOW IN QUOTES):

- -- THE AGREEMENT IS TO MONITOR SEISMIC SIGNALS, NOT "UNDERGROUND NUCLEAR TESTS";
- -- THE SOVIETS HAVE NOT/NOT MADE THE ARRANGEMENT CONTINGENT ON "WASHINGTON'S APPROVAL FOR RUSSIANS TO MONITOR TESTS IN THE UNITED STATES";
- -- THE PLAN CALLS FOR IN-COUNTRY MONITORING, NOT "ON-SITE INSPECTION";
- -- NO ARRANGEMENT HAS BEEN MADE FOR SOVIET MONITORING STATIONS "ON PRIVATE UNIVERSITY PROPERTY IN CALIFORNIA";
- -- THE DELEGATION DOES NOT BELIEVE THE SOVIETS HAVE LIMITED THE ARRANGEMENT TO PRIVATE U.S. SCIENTISTS, BUT ARE SEEKING SOVIET CLARIFICATION OF THIS.

7. NRDC DELEGATION MEMBERS INCLUDE ADRIAN DE WIND, NRDC CHAIRMAN, NRDC STAFFER THOMAS COCHRAN, DR. CHARLES ARCHAMBEAUR UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO, DR. JACK EVERNDEN, U.S. GEOLOGICAL SURVEY, FRANK VON HIPPEL, PRINCETON UNIVERSITY, AARON TOVISH, PARLIAMENTARIANS GLOBAL ACTION, AND CHRISTOPHER PAINE (AFFILIATION NOT KNOWN).

8. DELEGATION WILL BE HOLDING A PRESS CONFERENCE UPON RETURN TO U.S. TO DISCUSS THE AGREEMENT. THEY WILL SEEK A MEETING WITH THE DEPUTY SECRETARY IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

9. COMMENT. SEVERAL MEMBERS OF THIS GROUP ARE APPARENTLY HOSTILE TO THE ADMINISTRATION'S ARMS CONTROL POLICIES. THEY MAY USE THIS AGREEMENT TO ATTACK THE ADMINISTRATION'S POSITIONS ON SOVIET TESTING MORATORIUM, NON-RATIFICATION OF TTBT, INTERIM RESTRAINT, AND VERIFICATION. THE SOVIETS WILL ALMOST CERTAINLY GIN UP THE PROPAGANDA MILL ON THIS ONE -- THE IMPORTANCE THEY MUST ATTACH TO IT IS DEMONSTRATED BY THEIR MAKING VELIKHOV AVAILABLE, DESPITE HIS DUTIES COPING WITH THE CHERNOBYL' DISASTER, TO MEET WITH THE DELEGATION. WE DO NOT KNOW WHETHER THE U.S. EQUIPMENT INVOLVED REQUIRES AN EXPORT LICENSE. END COMMENT.
