Dear Mr. Casey:

The Committee has reviewed and does not object to the reprogramming action submitted in your letter of 3 April 1986.

The Committee is concerned, however, that much of this reprogramming need results from an obvious inability of past program management to correctly identify both personnel and equipment requirements for the old and new headquarters buildings. Indeed, such requirements should have been well documented over the past several years based on the Agency's planning for the new building and on the budgeted manpower growth submitted annually to the Congress. Moreover, the requirement to cover additional costs of escort personnel raises concern as to current program management.

The issue of security greatly concerns the Committee. Specifically, the leased lines were not controlled by the Agency. Contractors were permitted to freely add to the existing telephone grid. The Committee seeks the Agency's assessment of the security implications on these decisions.

The committee is convinced of the urgency of the reprogramming request and will not object at this time. It does, however, request by 1 August a response to the question of security. The Committee will more thoroughly review the Agency's telecommunications proposal during consideration of its FY 1987 budget request.
