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INTERDEPARTMENTAL COVER SUPPORT

TO OPERATION BLUE MOON

I. OPERATIONAL OBJECTIVE:

The objective of Operation BLUE MOON is low altitude photographic reconnaissance of selected military and intelligence targets on the Island of Cuba. The instrument to be used to accomplish the objective is the F8U aircraft.

II. GENERAL OPERATIONAL COVER PLAN:

During recent months, the United States has intensified its surveillance of the whole Caribbean area in order to acquire up-to-the-minute information on the nature and extent of the communist buildup. The U. S. Navy is flying normal surveillance missions in support of this objective, using F8U aircraft.

III. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS OPERATION THE FOLLOWING AREAS ARE CONSIDERED TO BE:

A. Hostile

Cuba

B. Other

Puerto Rico

Jamaica

Bahamas

Haiti

Dominican Republic

IV. PERTINENT COVER STORIES TO BE DISSEMINATED BY RESPONSIBLE ACTION OFFICES ARE INDICATED BELOW:

A. General Cover Story:

1. A comprehensive rationale for Operation BLUE MOON is found in the final communique of the Informal Meeting of Ministers of Foreign

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Affairs of the American Republics which was held in Washington on October 2 and 3, 1962, which reads in pertinent part as follows:

"The meeting observed that it is desirable to intensify surveillance of the delivery of arms and implements of war and all other items of strategic importance to the communist regime in Cuba, in order to prevent the secret accumulation in the Island of arms that can be used for offensive purposes against the Hemisphere. "

The United States has intensified its surveillance of the Caribbean through the use of every means available to the nation to acquire up-to-the-minute information on the nature and extent of the communist buildup.

3. Coordinating Office Prior to Release:

B. Activities at Training/Staging Bases:

1. Cover Story:

None required. The presence of an F8U aircraft on a training/staging base requires no explanation.

C. Incident over Hostile Territory (See III, A):

1. Cover Story:

In this instance, the pilot is under strict instructions to destroy his aircraft at sea, with one exception. If he is within emergency landing distance of the Guantanamo Naval Base, he will head off-shore, contact the base by pre-arranged signal, which will scramble a fighter escort, and land at Guantanamo.

If he falls into the hands of Castro forces, he will provide name, rank, serial number, and no further information.

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2. Responsible Action Office:

3. Coordinating Office Prior to Release:

D. Incident Over Other Territory Outside the U. S. (see III, B):

1. Cover Story:

None required. The presence of an F8U aircraft on a training/staging mission requires no explanation.

E. Hostile Protest Without Incident:

1. Cover Story:

There will be no comment.

2. Responsible Action Office: Department of State (Mr Hilsman)

3. Coordinating Office Prior to Release:

Department of Defense (Dr Charyk)

F. Emergency Landing at Civilian Airport within Continental United States with Journalists or Photographers Present:

1. Cover Story:

a. If aircraft shows battle damage, pilot may state, if queried by the press, that he was engaged in peripheral surveillance. If queried, he will deny overflight of Cuba.

b. If aircraft shows no battle damage, no cover story is required (see IV, B).

2. Responsible Action Office:

Department of Defense (Dr Charyk)

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3. Coordinating Office Prior to Release:

Department of State (Mr Hilsman)
