Soviets in Afghanistan

Timeframe: 1985-86

Region: USSR, South Asia, and Persian Gulf

Scenario:

- 1. A massive influx of Soviet forces into Afghanistan with the announced purpose of quelling the insurgency.
- 2. Moscow issues a diplomatic and public warning to Pakistan and Iran to halt their support to the Afghan insurgents and initiates small scale raids along the Pakistani and Iranian borders with ground and air units.
- 3. India provides strong public support for the Soviets and undertakes large-scale exercises along the Pakistanti border.

Problem:

Invoking its mutual defense pact with the United States, Islamabad requests immediate US material, diplomatic, and military support; representatives of the Iranian Government secretly approach the United States for covert support. What should be the US policy objectives and actions in meeting the Soviet threat and dealing effectively with Pakistan, Iran and India?
