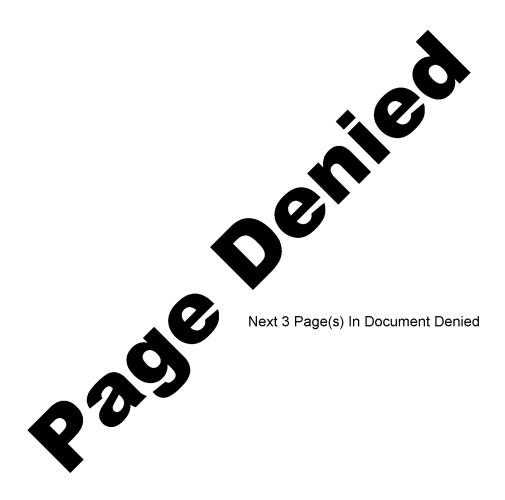

The year ahead holds the promise of equally notable achievements. It offers continuing challenge, as we face expanding requirements. It also affords opportunity: for us individually and as a team.

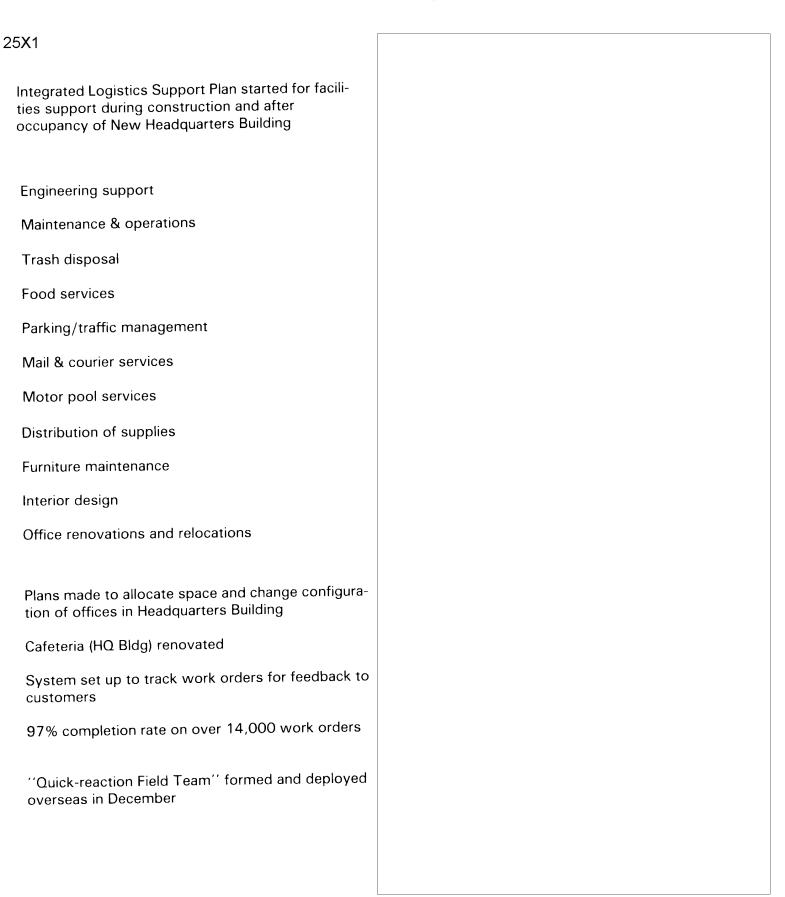

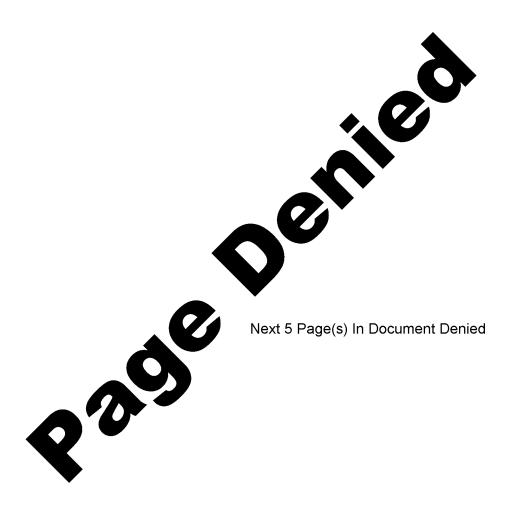
