NEW YORK, June 8, Reuter - Jamaica's Prime Minister Michael Manley said in an interview published today that "we all know that the CIA is present in Jamaica," but denied the agency is involved in an effort to destabilize his island nation, as some members of his own party have suggested.

MR Manley also told Newsweek International magazine that he will not declare a state of emergency in Janaica as he did in 1976; despite the growth of political violence; which he attributed to warring factions in Janaica's ghetto areas. Mr Manley said in the interview; conducted in New York last week; that it was the CIA'S "widespread use of gangster methods to terrorize Janaica"; in 1976 that led to the state of emergency decree at that time.
