

Dr. Robbin Laird of the Institute of Defense Analyses returned recently from a trip to Europe and used his trip as the basis for his remarks to the Soviet Foreign Policy Block on "The Soviets and the Western Alliance" on 30 November. Dr. Laird stated that the INF crisis was a watershed in Soviet thinking about Europe, and while Moscow lost the battle against Pershing II and cruise missile deployment, it won the war of promoting denuclearization. The Soviets have changed their approach from an obvious effort to divide the NATO alliance to an indirect one of appearing more reasonable by coming to terms with "good" Europeanization--economic and political integration, and opposing "bad" Europeanization--military integration.
