Calvin Tenney, Retired Senior Analyst at CIA

Dr. Calvin W. Tenney, 68, a retired senior analyst with the Central Intelligence Agency, died of pneumonia Friday at his home in Arlington.

He was a senior counter-intelligence analyst with the CIA for 20 years before retiring in 1971.

Dr. Tenney was a native of Gardner, Mass., and a graduate of Yale University. He also earned his doctoral degree in French language at Yale.

He served with the Office of Strategic Services (OSS) in Europe during World War II and later worked for the old Central Intelligence Group before leaving the government in 1947.

Dr. Tenney taught French at Wesleyans, University in Middletown, Conn., before returning to Washington and joining the CIA in 1951.

His wife, the former Alice Kuniholm, died in 1970. Survivors include two sons, Andrew J. and Thomas W., both of Arlington; two brothers, Ashton, of Nyack, N.Y., and Baxter, of Gardner, Mass.; a sister, Mary Anthony of San Diego, Calif., and two. grandchildren.
