1. STAT DCI			<p>On May 21st, the Senate passed S.J.Res. 104 (Tab A), a resolution declaring May 31 thru June 6, 1987 as "National Intelligence Community Week". It is co-sponsored by virtually all Members of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence (SSCI). This legislation was introduced last year but died in the House. We understand, however, that this week the House expects to take up and pass the resolution. The House version of H.J.Res. 151 (Tab B), is identical to the Senate version and was introduced by House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI) Members Stokes and Hyde (Tab B).</p> <p>In anticipation of the resolution therefore being sent to the President by the end of the week, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) called this morning asking the Agency to draft an appropriate Presidential proclamation.</p> <p>My staff prepared the attached draft (Tab C) which I am sending for comment to the Intelligence Community Staff and Public Affairs. A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS the work of the men and women of the Intelligence Community is essential to the national security of the United States and to the cause of freedom of democracy throughout the world;

WHEREAS the dedication of the men and women of the Intelligence Community to the service of their country in difficult and dangerous circumstances abroad, and in arduous, intellectually challenging assignments at home, is deserving of special recognition;

WHEREAS efforts should be made to foster an understanding and appreciation on the part of the American people that intelligence is the first line of national defense and that an effective intelligence capability is vital to the safety and well-being of the United States; and

WHEREAS it is particularly appropriate to recognize the continuing contribution of our intelligence officers during the week of the anniversary of the birth of Nathan Hale, an early patriot, hero, and practitioner of American intelligence, who symbolizes the selfless dedication of our Nation's intelligence personnel;

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has passed S.J.Res. 104, a resolution to designate the week of May 31, 1987 through June 6, 1987 as "National Intelligence Community Week."



NOW, THEREFORE, I, RONALD REAGAN, President of the United States of America, do hereby proclaim the week of May 31, 1987 through June 6, 1987, as "National Intelligence Community Week." I urge all Americans to join with me in recognizing the important role intelligence has played in American history. I call upon our schools to insure this subject is given the special recognition it deserves in the study of our history.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this twenty-_____ day of May, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and eighty-seven, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and eleventh.
