When I was in Colorado Springs, John Stroud, Jr., president of the Arkansas Bar Association, and Dennis Shackleford asked me to contact you concerning the possibility that you might be the principle speaker at the association's next annual meeting which will be held from Wednesday, June 8, until Saturday, June 11, 1988. 
RE: Speaking Invitation Arkansas Bar Association Arkansas Judicial Council Hot Springs, Arkansas 9 June 1988

It was good to see everyone at the Eighth Circuit Conference and thank you for your kind remarks about my speech.


