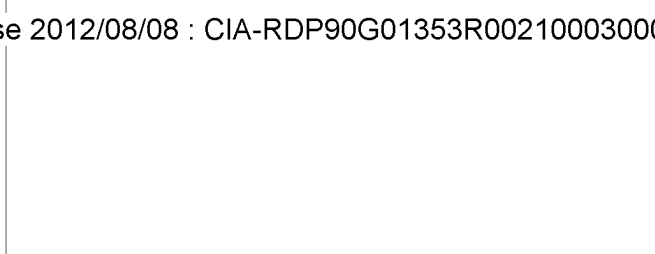


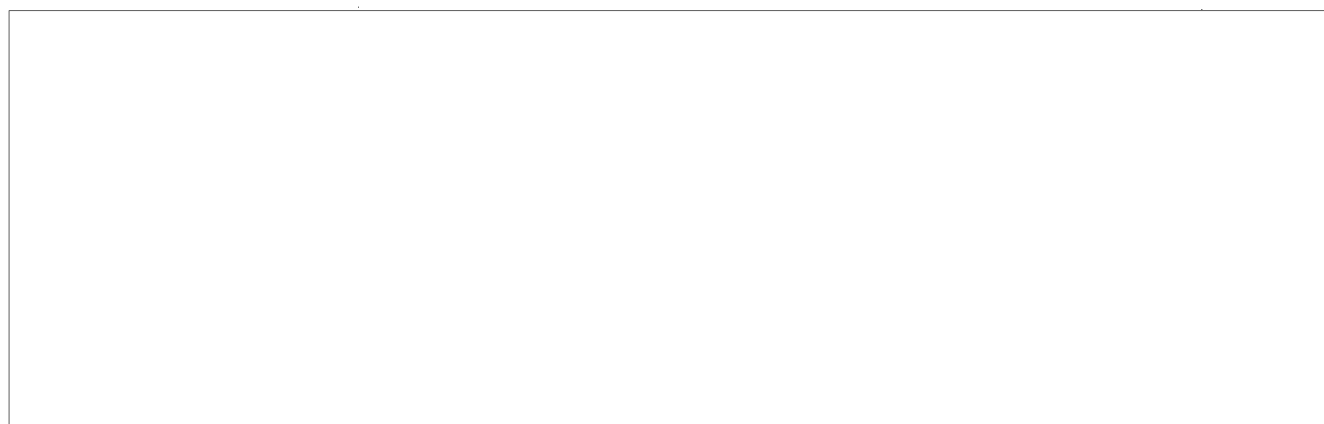

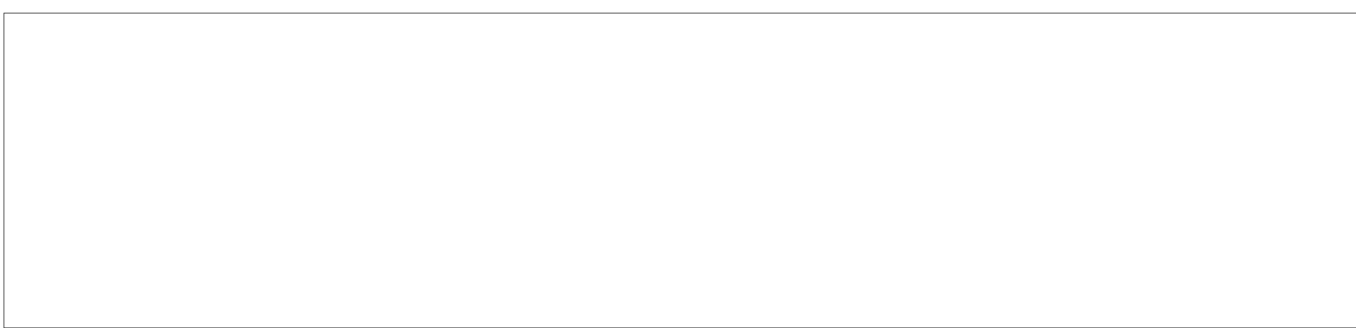

Executive Appearances and Invitations

The DCI spoke to an audience of 500 lawyers and judges representing the U.S. District Court of the District of Columbia and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit at the 1988 Judicial Conference in Williamsburg. The Chairman of the conference, Judge Ruth Ginsberg, commented that the Director "conveyed great integrity and that the feeling in general was that the speech was truly inspirational." She added that the DCI's appearance was the highlight of the conference.

DCI also presented The SASA William O. Baker award to Dr. Edwin H. Land at the SASA Annual Awards Testimonial Dinner on 25 May. Dr. Baker received the award for Dr. Land who could not attend.

The DDCI addressed approximately 500 members of the Austin Council on Foreign Affairs and Friends of the LBJ Library. The attendees represent leaders of the business and university communities interested in foreign affairs.

The Office of Soviet Analysis (SOVA) delivered the first weekly update of the Soviet withdrawal from Afghanistan to Ambassador Robert Oakley, the National Security Council's Special Assistant for Near Eastern and South Asian Affairs. [REDACTED]

The Office of Scientific Weapons Research (OSWR) and SOVA briefed the Army Planning Council chaired by Army Secretary John Marsh, on projections of nuclear proliferation in the year 2000. This was the culmination of a series of such briefings requested by the Army's long-range planning staff. This component plans and suggests strategies in order for the Army to address the future environment the military may have to face. [REDACTED]

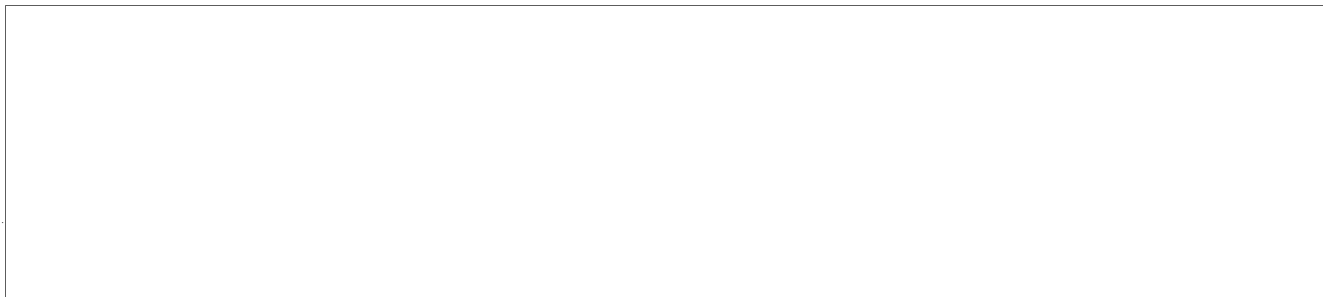


Contacts with Congress

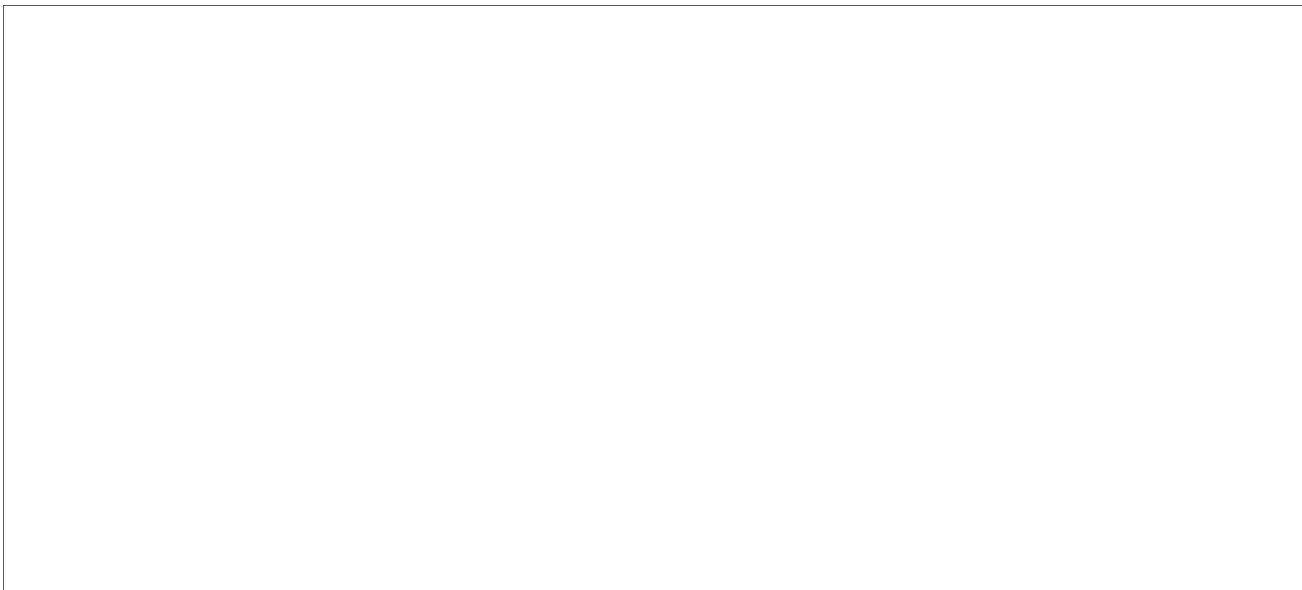
SUBJECT: Weekly Report for Period Ending 26 May 1988

1. The Office of Information Technology reached Initial Operating Capability for the basic recordkeeping functions of the Office of Personnel's automated FERS-THRIFT (Federal Employees Retirement System-Thrift Savings Plan) system.

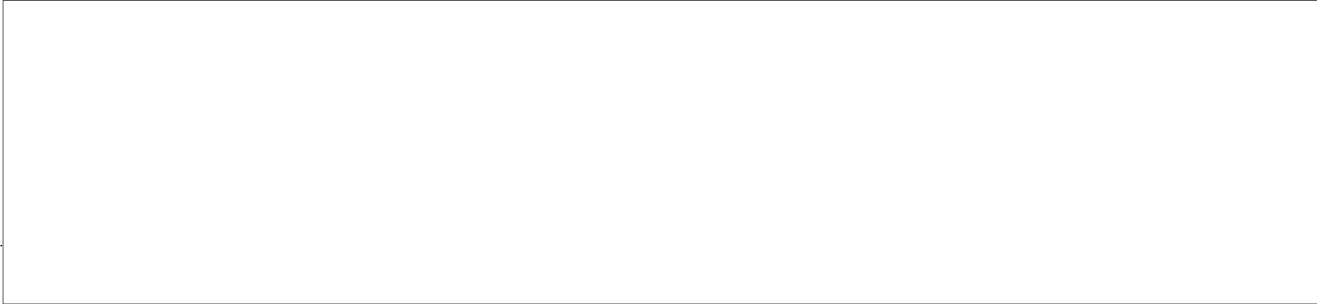
