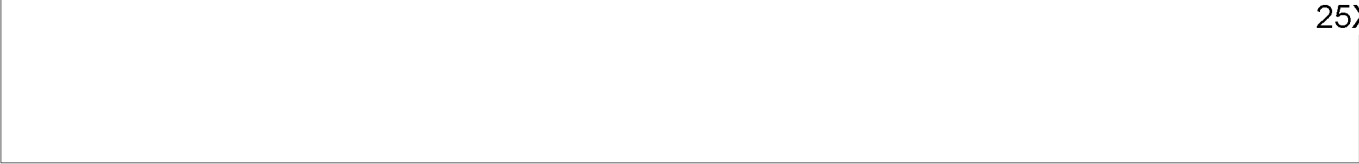

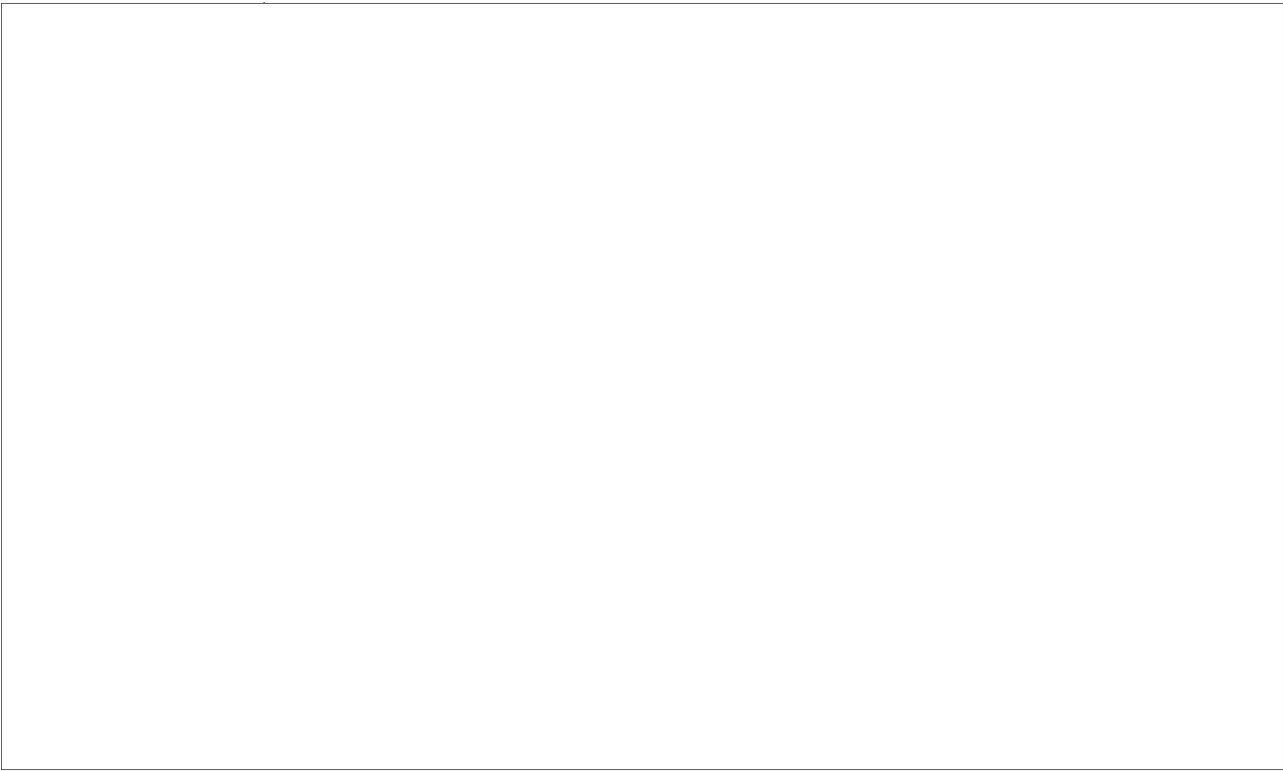

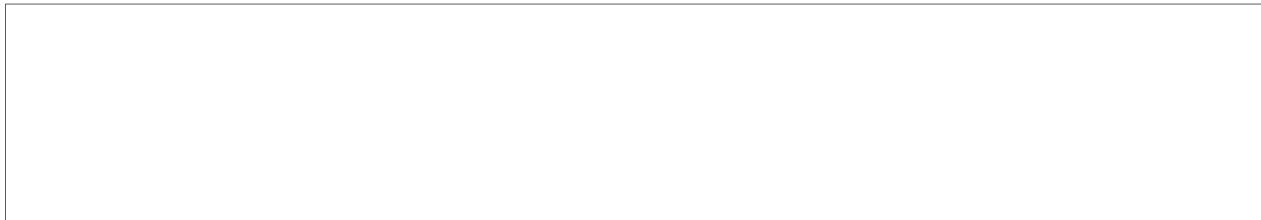

• Responding to intense Community interest in the latest round of ethnic violence in the Soviet republics of Armenia and Azerbaijan, the Foreign Broadcast Information Service (FBIS) Bureaus in London and Nicosia have intensified their monitoring efforts of Armenian and Azeri language broadcasts. This has resulted in a significant volume of material from these languages being disseminated via the FBIS Wire Service to high-level consumers. FBIS has also intensified coverage of Estonian media, reporting key speeches and developments in the ongoing confrontation with Moscow over the sovereignty issue.
