





- 9. The Office of Personnel reports that legislation extending the Voluntary Leave Transfer Program for five years has passed both the House and Senate and is awaiting the President's signature. To date, 24 cases have been approved and 16,000 hours of leave have been donated. Twenty Maternity/Paternity Leave-Sharing Program cases have also been approved; 3,269 annual/sick leave hours have been shared between spouses.
- 10. The Office of Information Technology (OIT) completed the first of eight scheduled relocations of PBX equipment from the Original Headquarters Building to the New Headquarters Building. Three major equipment items were moved and put in operation in the new Agency Computer Center with no interruption in service.
- 11. Guest speakers at the recent "Federal Conference on Computer Support for Handicapped Individuals" highlighted OIT's Physically Challenged Employee Resource Information Center as a successful effort to support handicapped federal employees.
