SUBJECT: Fine Arts Commission Meeting of 8 August 1988

1. Minutes from previous meeting were not available for approval.

2. New members were introduced: :

3. [redacted] (FBIS) reported on the plans they have developed, working with [redacted] of Logistics and "Poster Originals Ltd", to decorate the Reston buildings with poster art. \$31,000 has been allocated for ODE and \$15,000 for FBIS. Projects as described were approved by the Commission.

4. Regarding the use of large white message boards at the entrances to the compound, it was decided that the chairman, FAC would send a note to the director of Logistics asking that they be used only to convey urgent messages.

5. [redacted] chief of the Exhibits Committee, reported the following schedule:

- September: Hispanic Month Exhibit
- October: Handicapped Artists Exhibit
- November: Employee Art Exhibit [redacted] in charge)
- December and January: open
- April: employee photograph show
- May: exhibit related to Asia-Pacific Month
- May: (space conflict with above to be resolved) Exhibit related to speech on 20th Anniversary of the Bill of Rights.

Suggestions were solicited for months not already booked.

6. [redacted] reported on plans for interior landscaping of the new building. No clear decisions made; issue will be discussed at September meeting.

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7. Chairman, F.A.C., reported on art for the new building. A contract has been signed with James Sanborn for a sculpture. We still have to approve his design; no monies will be paid should we disapprove it. Matt Mulligan, awarded the contract for an interior design motif, has declined to accept it, and the National Endowment for the Arts is searching for a substitute artist.

8. Following a meeting with Jim Baker, the F.A.C. is awaiting a reply from the DCI regarding the tentative choice of Kinsler to paint his official portrait.

9. Other items: It was determined that bust of George Bush, as a representation of a former DCI was appropriate for us to have on display, despite some complaints of political favoritism during the campaign season; chairman, F.A.C. will write letter to the woman who complained about the quality of some frames on the DCI portraits.
