1. In response to his request of 9 May, I called on Majority Leader Mr. McCormack, who wished to discuss four matters with me:

a. The personnel case of [redacted] - In this case STATINTL
STATINTL Mr. McCormack merely desired certain background on the reasons for
the rejection of [redacted] application so that he might properly
answer his constituent. I informed Mr. McCormack that it was a
routine rejection which was being kept in our active files as [redacted] STATINTL
