On Monday, 22 February 1960, Mr. Mandel (Senate Internal Security Subcommittee) called and asked if we could translate an article in the magazine ESTUDIOS SOBRE EL COMUNISMO for October-December 1959 and January-March 1960 concerning illegal Communist Party organization in the Mediterranean area. The article was written by Pedro de Domingo. He also mentioned a NEW YORK TIMES article of 21 February 1960, page 10, which describes a liberal anti-Communist school in Costa Rica. This school allegedly has thirty teachers who have been trained in Marxist theory. Mr. Mandel feels that some of these individuals might be good witnesses for the Subcommittee. He asked if we would check on this.

5. Jay Sourwine, Staff Director for the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee, called to alert us to the presence in New York of one Francisco Calcedia Estrada, a former member of the Cuban police under Batista. He and three other individuals, Vitoria Opasa, Caster Prieto and Pas Demensch, have allegedly been in contact with the Communist Party at 110 Fifth Avenue concerning the President's trip to Chile. Mr. Sourwine pointed out that this information was not given to him directly so he could not comment on the source. He merely passed it on to us for our information.

6. Talked with Mr. Frank Damon in Senator Hiram Fong's office about having the Senator over for lunch in the near future. Senator Fong is travelling to Hawaii on the 4th of March and will not return to Washington until the 14th of March. We will call Mr. Damon again at that time to arrange a suitable appointment.
