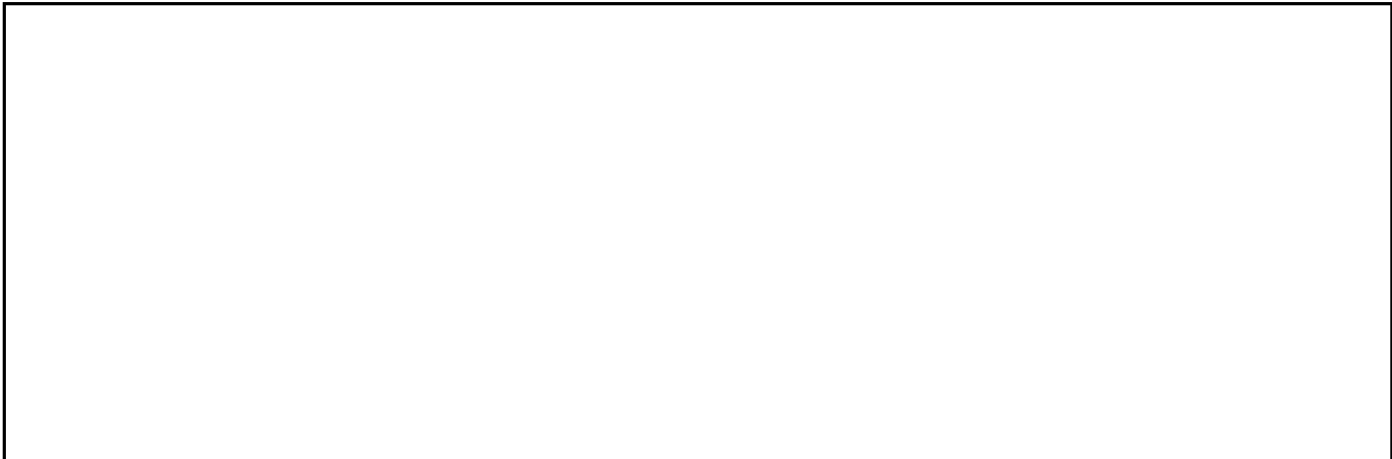

3. Dr. Scoville called regarding the letter from Spencer Beresford (House Sciences and Astronautics Committee) asking for information as a follow-up to the briefing on the Soviet rocket and missile programs. Scoville explained that he would be unable to answer the first question relating to the 1959 tests without discussing TOP SECRET information. After discussing this with Beresford it was agreed that we would exclude this item from the questions and deal with it in a separate document which would not be retained by the Committee.

4. Telephoned Colonel Rettgers, Army L&L, concerning his meeting with Senator John F. Kennedy (D., Mass.) on [redacted] Rettgers met with Senator Kennedy and his Administrative Assistant at 6:30 on Friday and discussed the case along the same lines used by Mr. Warner in other meetings with members of Congress. Senator Kennedy and the Administrative Assistant appeared more than satisfied.

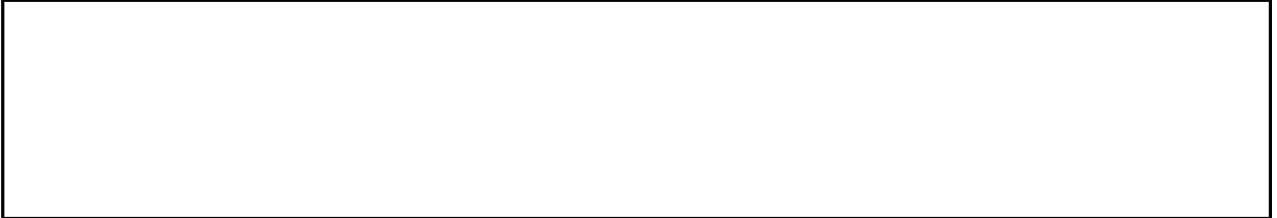

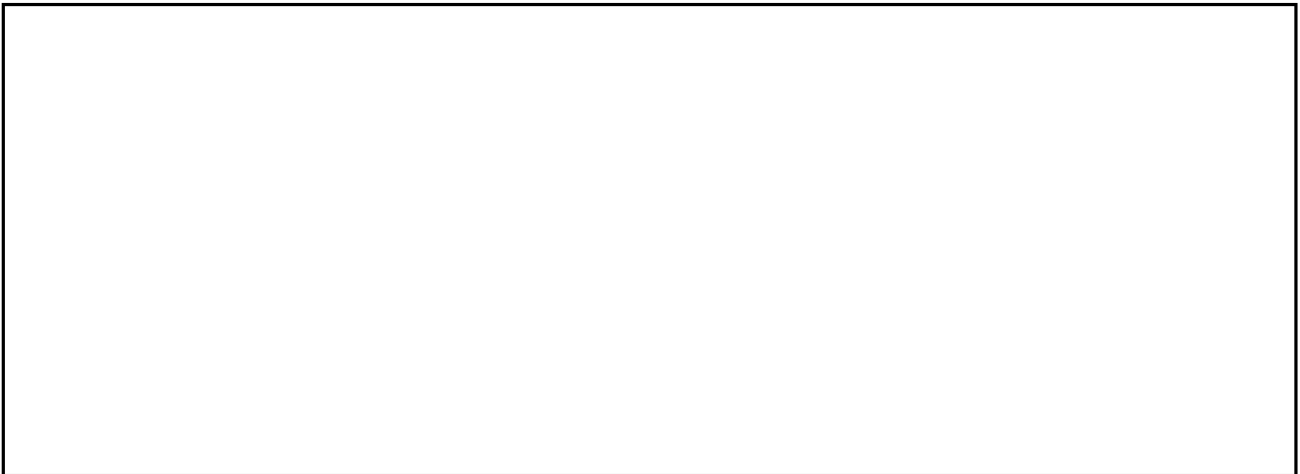

7. [redacted] met with Roland Severy, Bureau of the Budget, and discussed the provisions of H. R. 5007, the Overseas Allowances bill which will affect this Agency. Mr. Severy saw no objection to the suggestions which we intend to propose to the House Post Office and Civil Service Committee tomorrow. However, he pointed out that we could not indicate to the Committee that the Bureau of the Budget had formally approved our position on this legislation.

9. Met with Colonel Schuppener and Mr. Carstarphen of the House Science and Astronautics Committee staff. Attending for the Agency were Messrs. Borel, [redacted]. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the possibility of an Agency appearance before the House Science and Astronautics Committee to inform the members of the Agency's role in the dissemination of scientific information. It appears doubtful that time will permit an appearance. However, Schuppener asked if we could be prepared to make an appearance on short notice and briefly discuss
