

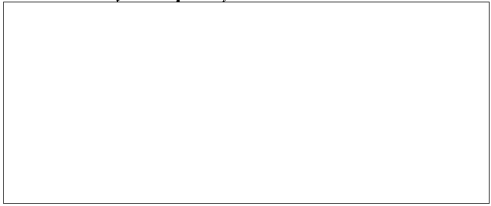

**KHRUSHCHEV ON THE SHIFTING  
BALANCE OF WORLD FORCES—A  
SELECTION OF STATEMENTS AND  
AN INTERPRETATIVE ANALYSIS  
(S. DOC. NO. 87)**

**MR. HUMPEREY.** Mr. President, recently I had the Library of Congress prepare a study on the statements of Mr. Khrushchev in regard to his attitude toward the power balance between the Soviet Union and its satellites and the United States and our allies—or, as commonly characterized, between the East and the West. In my opinion, this study is one of the most important documents I have ever read.

When I first read the valuable study, it was a mimeographed document distributed by the Legislative Reference Service of the Library of Congress. I wanted to bring this valuable study to the attention of my colleagues on the Foreign Relations Committee and, indeed, to the attention of all the American people. Therefore, I requested of the author, Dr. Joseph G. Whelan, and also of the Legislative Reference Service, permission to have it printed as a Senate document. My request was graciously granted.

I desire to express my thanks and appreciation to Dr. Joseph G. Whelan for bringing the study up to date.

Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent that the study entitled "Khrushchev on the Shifting Balance of World Forces—A Selection of Statements and an Interpretative Analysis" be printed as a Senate document.
