Wednesday - 5 August 1959

1. Pursuant to the request of Miss Ellen Collier, Legislative Reference Service of the Library of Congress, there was forwarded to her the following: 12 copies of the Director's speech of 24 July 1959; 5 copies of the speech of 8 April 1959; and five copies of the speech of 30 January 1959.

2. Boyd Crawford, Staff Director, House Foreign Affairs Committee, telephoned suggesting a time of 11 o'clock on Monday, 10 August 1959 to brief the Chairman, Dr. Morgan, and Mrs. Kelly on [redacted] The meeting would be in Room G-3 of The Capitol. In [redacted] will accompany Legislative Counsel for this briefing.

3. [redacted] telephoned saying the Director had signed the letter to Senator Henry M. Jackson but was interested in who was going to do the work on the report and when it would be completed. This was discussed with [redacted] who indicated that [redacted] was doing the work and if a comprehensive and detailed report were desired, it would require coordination between OGI, ORR, OSI and DD/P and could take up to sixty days. The Director was somewhat disturbed at this length of time and requested that he be provided with an outline in two or three days with an appropriate letter to Senator Jackson transmitting the outline and suggesting that Agency representatives meet with the staff to discuss the report. [redacted] has been advised of this.

4. [redacted] had spent several hours discussing SUC trade with Latin America and an unclassified paper is being prepared for additional consideration at two o'clock next Wednesday.

5. Met with Robert Smart, Chief Counsel, House Armed Services Committee staff, and exhibited to him a photostat of the Certificate of Appreciation presented to Air America, Inc. by the 315th Air Division in June 1959.
