1. Talked with Representative William G. Bray (R., Ind.) concerning his extensive trip through Black Africa mentioning that we would very much appreciate seeing him upon his return to collect his impressions and thoughts.

[redacted] I indicated we did not have any such requests. He stated he was taking his wife who was a professional secretary for the purpose of taking extensive notes and would be very pleased to meet with us upon his return. He seemed most appreciative of our calling.

5. Talked with Ken Bolieu concerning the proposed trip of Senator John Stennis (D., Miss.) to be accompanied by Harold Merrick of the staff of Senate Appropriations and Bolieu. Bolieu advised he was not traveling. After checking with the Senator, Bolieu advised that the Senator would be delighted to make contact and receive CIA briefings abroad. Appropriate cable will be prepared.

6. Talked with Richard Arens who advised that the House Committee on Un-American Activities planned to hold hearings either in El Paso or Houston in about two months dealing with the communist menace in Mexico. His query was whether we could assist in suggesting some witness who could testify on this subject. Their purpose is to alert the people of the southwest to the communist menace across the border. I told him I would advise on this. He said he would need something within the next two weeks.

Also arrangements were made for tomorrow to read the testimony of the individual who accused the RFE broadcaster in Munich of being a communist.

7. Delivered to Colonel Sullivan at the National War College basic information pertaining to the resolutions in the Congress for a Joint Committee on Intelligence plus bringing him up to date on the CIA Sub-committees in Congress. 25X1

8. Delivered to Walter Reynolds, Senate Government Operations Committee, General Cabell's statement before House Foreign Affairs on communist use of passports for display to Senator Grossing tomorrow morning. After it has served its purpose, Reynolds will call to have the statement picked up. Reynolds commented again how much Senator Humphrey was pleased with the briefing he received from Agency people in Paris last year.
