7. At the request of Jim Smith in the office of Senator Karl E. Mundt (R., S. Dak.) a copy of ^{SEN. CARROLL'S} ~~the statement~~ prepared statement to the House Foreign Affairs Committee on the issuance of passports to U. S. communists was delivered to the Senator's office. Later in the day, when Smith returned the statement, he indicated that it had been read by Senator Edmund S. Muskie (D., Me.) as well as Senator Mundt and that both the Senators were grateful for this information. Senator Ernest Gruening (D., Alaska) has asked that he be permitted to read it at 9:30 Tuesday morning immediately prior to a Subcommittee meeting.
