
This letter confirms the arrangements made by you and [redacted] by telephone on 8 March with respect to your participation in the National Warning Course. I understand you agreed to present at the mid-June pilot running of the course a session on perception and miscperception lasting up to four hours' duration. In this session you will draw on materials from your excellent book, our discussions, and your work here in Washington, which will serve as a case study.
