The GRILLFLAME Working Group (GFWG) has developed the following recommendations on the substance and tone of the GRILLFLAME Scientific.

Evaluation Committee's report on paranormal phenomena. The report contains many factual errors and an inordinate number of ambiguities in the body of the report that, taken alone would confuse policy planners and other readers. However we found strong agreement with and support much of the report. Those conclusions and recommendations which are strongly agreed or disagreed with are highlighted below.

The sweet strongly agree with the following:

Conclusions

- 1. Unexplained observation of human capability to generate data of potential intelligence utility has been documented.
- 2. Scientific proof of these unexplained capabilities has not been accomplished because of a lack of controls, documentation, repeatability and other limitations.

Recommendations

- 1. Exploratory testing of the utility of these unexplained capabilities should continue and increase in scope.
- 2. Until sufficient and compelling observations or theories are advanced, basic scientific research on these capabilities and their characteristics are unlikely to be successful.
- A central coordination and review authority for all GRILLFLAME type applications and investigations is needed.

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4. Foreign intelligence analysis on explained human capability should be considered.

Strong Disagreement with the Following

Finally, the working group notes it was most disappointed by the lack of original thought in the report. From the viewpoint and experience of this committee, this report has added no new information of value to either advancing the utility or dismissing the importance of these infrequent, but impressive unexplained capabilities.

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
