CG's aide

On 27 July 1982 I met with CPT Marvin ~~in~~ in an attempt to interpret an informal note written on the attached document. The note had been scribbled by CG Inscom on 8 July when he reviewed the attached document. The document was returned to ~~me~~ DET G (hand carried by CPT Marvin) in BG Weinstein's area immediately after providing BG Weinstein the "package" DET G briefing. BG Weinstein viewed the attached document and CG note and related that the CG had not provided any tasking (posturing no need for concern).

CPT Marvin provided his interpretation of the note and said that he would send DET G a copy of the "Klaus after action report" if we wanted. (He will)

- After this meeting CPT Marvin stated that the "CG was wondering if he could observe some of the training that ~~you~~ you (DET G) are doing." I related that to "observe" the training would be time consuming and boring and as such would not be worth the CG's valuable time. I asked CPT Marvin what he thought the CG wanted to know. CPT Marvin stated that the CG knew what DET G did but did not know how we did it or how we trained personnel. I explained that these questions could be best addressed in a full operational briefing including a tour of the DET G area. CPT Marvin said that he thought that this would be a good idea and he would ~~see~~ inquire as to the CG's desires. I told CPT Marvin that a full briefing and tour would take 2 hours and that if the CG wanted this briefing that perhaps he should make the trip to Ft Meade in conjunction with some

other duty at FT Meade. CPT Marvin agreed and stated that the CG would be coming to FT Meade for a scheduled breakfast around the first of September.
