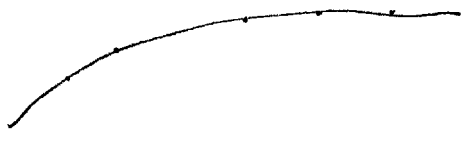

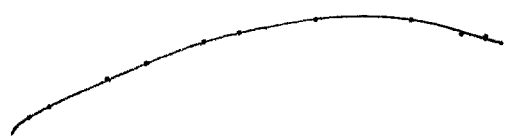
A. sloping up across

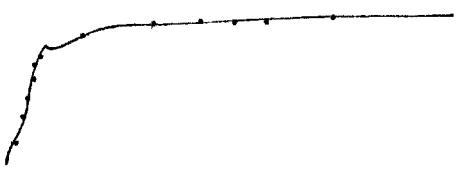

UNCONSCIOUS

The major learning point I gained from this afternoon's session is that the ~~sub~~conscious will take tasking, not only from the monitor but also from my conscious. The immediate responsiveness of the ~~sub~~conscious was quite surprising. When Ed told my ~~sub~~conscious that we needed to move on to another feature of the site, the next iteration of coordinates generated a new ideogram. When (easter island site) I told my ~~sub~~conscious to please give the gestalt Ed wanted/was working toward getting me honed in on, bam! the next ideogram was the one that distinguished the site as an island. All in all, I must say I find that the ability of the system to respond to direct tasking is a rather incredible one. Tomorrow's ideogram drills will hopefully teach my subconscious an easier and more rapid way to describe an island.

A more mundane gain from today's session was learning to hold my pen without leaning heavily on my entire hand as I normally do. This definitely allows for the ideogram to flow with less physical impedance.

I need to pay more attention to page format. I'm still not writing breaks far enough toward the right and at the start of one of today's sites I didn't allow enough room between the header data and the first ideogram. I had no room to write the A, which irritated me to the point I lost my concentration and had to break. A simple cure for all of this is to slow down. Simple but not easy as I am still so excited by everything, I want to rush through it so I can do more.
