SUBJECT: Results of SRV sessions for week of 3-7 July, 1987.

1. TARGET: The target was to describe the picture on the cover of the 17 August 87 issue of Newsweek Magazine.

2. SESSIONS: Only one session was held this week, due to other involvements. This session used the standard CRV method.

3. RESULTS: The picture will contain a tangle of lines which all seem to be concentrically cupped, except for a small "bump" of lines in the middle. The lines are also crossed by radiating lines going out from the middle (AOL: like a circular graph). The cup of lines, however, is all warped and twisted irratically. There seems to be an object placed horizontally in front of the cupped lines. There may be a picture of a person, but if so, it is small in relation to the cover. The most noticable feature is the garish colors. Main colors seem to be ugly glowing green and reddish-brown.

2. RVer's CRITIQUE: Mass of lines and the object are suspect, due to the fact that they were constantly changing shape each time their perception was received. Picture of person may have been AOL. The object seems to feel correct, and the garish colors were constant.
