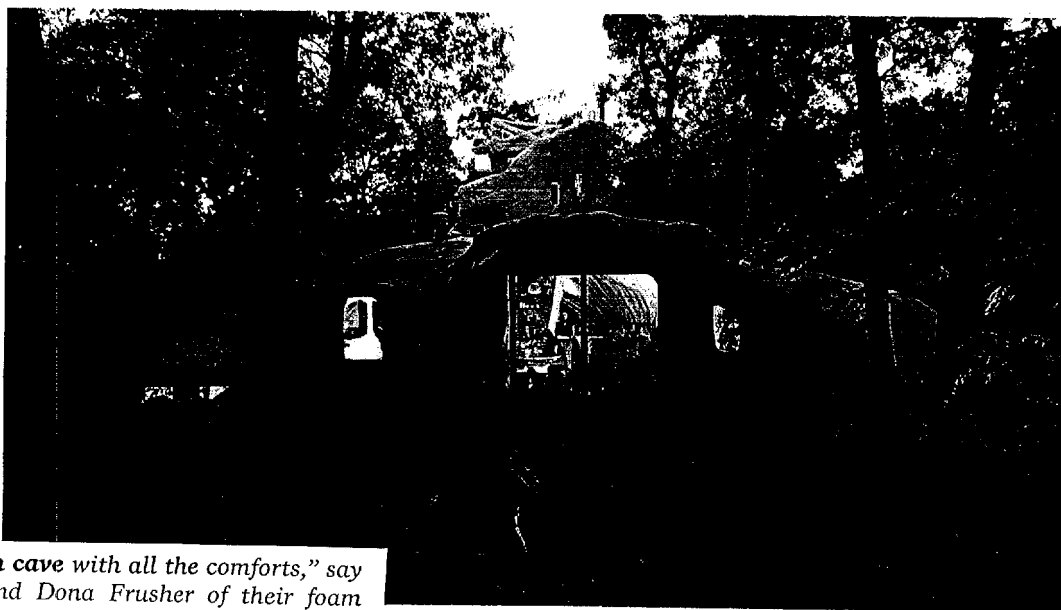
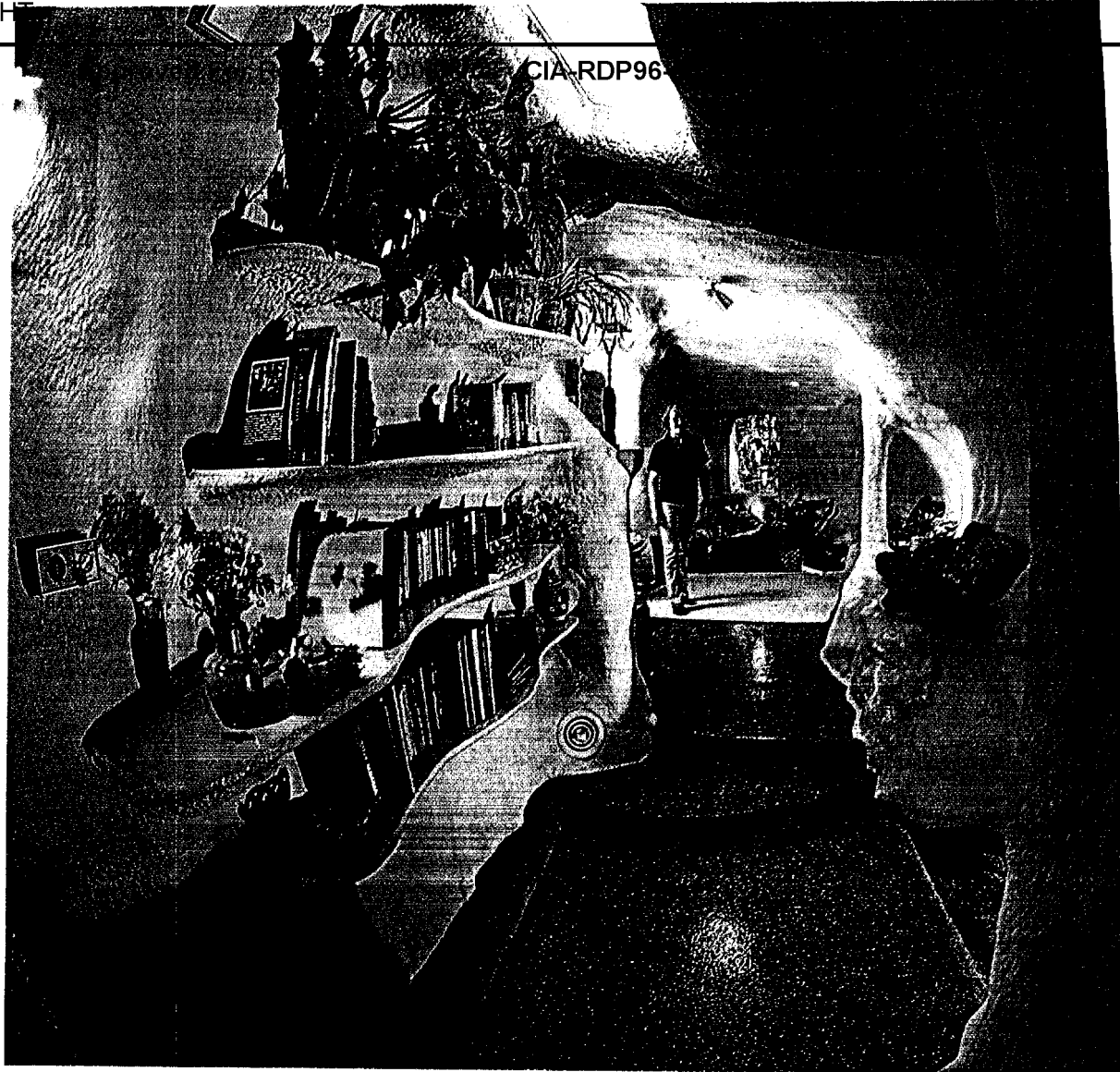
E. SESSION SUMMARY:

"A warm cave with all the comforts," say Fritz and Dona Frusher of their foam home (above). The couple fashioned the structure by inflating plastic sheets and spraying them, 6 to 8 inches thick, with polyurethane, a material used as insulation. A small forced-air furnace heats the house at a fraction of the cost for a conventional dwelling. The free-form structure seems to blend into the surrounding, a rocky bluff (left) near Barneveld, Wisconsin.
