SUBJECT: Revision of Appendix to DCID 1/20

- 1. As you know, the countries and areas in which visits, travel, and assignment are considered to be a "hazardous activity" are listed in the appendix to DCID 1/20. The Compartmentation Subcommittee periodically submits recommended changes to the appendix to the DCI SECOM. Subsequent to SECOM approval, the actual revision to the DCID is issued by the NFIB as a "Memorandum for Holders of DCID 1/20."
- 2. This process sometimes takes a matter of two to three months from the date of the Compartmentation Subcommittee recommendation to issuance of the NFIB memorandum. As there is usually a degree of urgency in adjusting the listing of "hazardous activities," earlier promulgation of these changes is recommended.
- 3. The Compartmentation Subcommittee recommends that NFIB Secretariat agreement be obtained to enable future changes to the DCID 1/20 "hazardous activities" listing be promulgated under authority of the SECOM Chairman or (as a alternative recommendation) the Compartmentation Subcommittee. Specifically:
- a. Changes recommended by the Compartmentation Subcommittee would be sent to the SECOM Chairman. (Subcommittee members would coordinate recommendations with their SECOM principal prior to this step to insure agreement—dissenting minority Subcommittee views would be "footnoted.")
- b. SECOM Chairman would approve/reject recommended Subcommittee changes without placing the matter before the SECOM membership and without referral of the matter to the NFIB Secretariat.
- c. SECOM Chairman would notify the Compartmentation Subcommittee Chairman of the approval/rejection of the recommendations. The Compartmentation Subcommittee would then be responsible for forwarding an appropriate change to DCID 1/20 to the NFIB Secretariat and all holders of DCID 1/20.
- 4. It is emphasized that the above procedure would only be followed with respect to changes to the DCID 1/20 "hazardous activities"
