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UJDROWSY/UJDRUM cover channel - With reference to the mysterious piece of mail revealed had been sent from UJDROWSY to UJDRUM, FLEMING said a thorough search was made of Bundespost records in order to try to pin down the Postamt where the mail had been received. FLEMING said that he was optimistic that the receipt that UJDROWSY had to sign in order to get the insured letter would be found and only hoped UJDROWSY did not hear about the search from any of the contacts in the Bundespost. FLEMING noted that it was particularly suspicious that the letter had been sent to UJDRUM in such a rush and under conditions that made it clear this was a frequently used private letter drop just two or three days before UJDRUM was scheduled to go to Berlin in connection with Paul BANANE.

FLEMING asked if it would be possible for us to query the Bundespost as to whether or not he knew UJDRUM. FLEMING commented that their respective backgrounds were such that they might well be acquainted. FLEMING also noted that UJDROWSY, in the recent past had made several trips to Berlin and was very puzzled just what he was doing there. FLEMING said that although it was a long shot, there seemed to be some chance he could be seeing UJDRUM there and would leave it entirely up to us how we wish to handle this, whether or not it was necessary to bury UJDRUMS case.

FLEMING said he thought it very likely that UJDROWSY had been recruited by the British - possibly before or just after he had been dropped by the British. (UJDROWSY had been dropped on 15 April 1950.) FLEMING recalled UJDROWSY's trip to Dresden in 1948 or 9 - when he made an unauthorized trip to Dresden in connection with his mission to the GDR for the British. [] asked if FLEMING knew whether or not the British had dropped UJDROWSY. FLEMING replied that UPHILL's only information was that the British had dropped UJDROWSY because of his contacts with dangerous contacts, including UJDRUM and PROESTING, on whom the British had derogatory information. UPHILL had tried to obtain this derogatory information or contact of UJDROWSY, and FLEMING said no effort had been made to do so. FLEMING said that it would not be a good idea to request this information soonest, and that it probably would be - and that it had not been done this far for fear of British interest and curiosity.

FLEMING then noted some other early security considerations (already mentioned) and also got on the subject of UJDRUM and when he had been recruited, the main question in his mind was whether UJDRUM had recruited UJDROWSY or vice versa. When asked how he was so sure UJDRUM was a recruited Soviet agent, FLEMING noted several factors highlighted in the UJDRUM Lebenslauf he had provided us, and that the evidence, although very incriminating, was nonetheless conclusive.
