## Bonn Trades Soviet Spy For 3 Youths

BONN, Feb. 14—A Soviet apy sentenced to 14 years imprisonment has been exchanged for three West German students imprisoned in the Soviet Union, the Ministry for All-German Affairs announced today.

Heinz Folfo, sontenced to 14 years imprisonment for treason in 1963, was exchanged for Peter Sonntag, Walter Naumann and Volker Schaffnanson, all given prison sentences for political reasons in Russia.

The Ministry gave no details of where or when the exchange took place, Felle has already served more than six years of his sentence, the brief annuary ment said.

[The West German government had no official comment on the case, However, Dan Morgan of the Washington Pust reported that Bonn sources cautioned privately against drawing a connection between the announcement and the present Berlin situation. Thus, there was nothing to indicate immediately that the release of the spy was part of the present series of top level Soviet-German diplomatic moves.]

The trial of Felle, who worked for the West German counter-espionage agency, was one of the biggest West German spy cases.

The Federal Court said in its judgment that Felfe and two accomplices had betrayed vital state socrets to the Sovict Union.

There was no doubt that he was a top agent of the Soviet secret service operating in the heart of the counter-esplonage agency and had caused considerable damage, the court said.

Ilis chief accomplice, Hans Clemens, was semenced to tenyears and a lawyer, Erwin Tiebel, who acted as messenger, to three years.
