JBX 002-1204 -Dentist. An agent, possibly pro-allied.
11/3/44 -Budapest surgeon. Actively anti-German and pro-Allied. In contact with Hanz, underground. Has accepted 2 radio sets.

JBX 2281a Born: 8 Mar 98, Mezokapus, Department Torda-Aranyos, Transylvania.
31 Jan 46 Physician who practices at Budapest VI, Lazar ut. 13. Left Transyl. after Peace Treaty of Trianon and lived in Hung. whe. He joined the Panta Miklos Society which fought against German influence in Hung. During WW2 was active leader of Hanz. resistance movement, fighting against the Germans and for Western orientation of Hung. Fitter enemy of communism, in which he sees a disguised Slav imperialism, hopes to win Western support for his fight. Man of great courage and intellect, aside from his great ties, considered reliable.
Approache office at Austria seeking connection with American authorities.

JRI 3835 Dr. Miklos CSCNGS is a physician and a member of the Social Democrat

Forwarding additional traces: Report from BARI (date uncertain) states that Miklos CSCNGS who arrived in Austria after the war was Arrow Cross deputy during the war. Identity not established. Miklos CSCNGS (q.v. Austria) biographical information confirms opposition of subject to Nazi domination and collaboration with both rightist and leftist elements in the resistance movement as outlined in A 49572. BI calls subject a Nationalist-Communist who favors an independent Communist Hungary, aligned toward but not subservient to USSR,

Subject came to the attention of the mission in 44 through "Johnson" who informed us subject had managed to maintain a hidden radio set during the German occupation of Hung. and that he was a reliable member of the underground. Himler met subj in Buda in Sept 45 at which time subj was still connected with known members of the underground, and also was in ~~source~~ clandestine touch with Prime Minister Miklos. In Jan 46 subj came to Vienna asking SSU to underwrite a network of intel. service in Hung. with a proposed budget of \$40,000 a year, and was told the SSU might consider some expenses for certain info; in Apr 46 subj came to Vienna with 4 other men with an official letter from one of the Ministries of Hung. commissioning him to restore as many autos as he could to Hung.; he was given \$400 plus \$100 for a camera and received specific instructions as to certain targets; he took back 12-13 autos to Hung. using the Salzburg office to facilitate this end of his mission; 5 weeks later in Buda he contacted Himler with a new set of editorials containing info in the Hung. press and was told we no longer needed intel. service in Hung. as we only needed info in connection with the Peace Conference and did not expect to maintain such service in a friendly country, that the SSU ~~was~~ had gone out of business and his services were not longer needed. Subject then demanded an additional \$800 claiming he had paid his help for 3 months, but was told such

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requests must be forwarded to Wash. Subject was dropped for the following reasons: Suspicious of his possible new connections since he travel back and forth with a group of people and with a number of cars without a Russian permit; he is extremely indiscreet; there was no real info in the 50-60 lengthy papers written by him; he is prejudiced, being Transylvanian; he wishes to used his connection with SSU to further black market action between Austria and Hungary; greed stronger than patriotism; did not buy camera for which he received \$100; did not furnish info on specific targets for which he received money.

- 1946 ~~xxxxxxxx~~ Himler told CSOMOS to stop intel. work because it is not in the interests of the US to work against the Soviets. All contact with American officers ceased at this time. CSOMOS was sentenced to death but the sentence has not been carried out because of the abblishment of the death penalty.
- ROME 512 It was learned from a Vienna subsource that CSOMOS, Miklos, applied for
5 Dec 46 an Italian visa to proceed to Italy, allegedly on a mission for the Hung. secret police.
- LSI 481 Upon his last sortie from Buda, CSOMOS arrived in Vien without previous
17 Dec 46 clearance, and was advised by Travel Control to return to Buda. Instead, he erased the date from his previous pass and proceeded to Sals. There he was arrested with F70,000 on him; he was released and sent to Buda. Since he is able to secure a Russian pass, any number of black Russian ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ permits for cars, and since he is now working for BOKODI, he is undoubtedly working for the Russians.
- HEID 1827 When subj was apprehended on Jan 47 he told the following story: He
29 Aug 47 had been contacted in Sep 45 by Col. Martin Himler who induced subj to work for him by inducing a group to spread anti-Communist propaganda and to provide info. Himler promised that the US would help Hung. regain Transylvania.
- MGH 1845 This doc (filed in the TAKACH-DENISOV file) concerns Dr. Miklos CSOMOS
20 Nov 47 and his associates. Additional info supplied by Takacs.
- MOHA 2306 ~~53 yrs; 179 cm; 83 kg; stout; sparse, graying hair;~~
20 Nov 47 blue eyes; pink complexion; round, fat face; normal nose.
Married; 2 children; at interrogation used to say that he would like to work for the Russians; lives at 13 Lazar St., Buda.
- CCB 45617 Hung. surgeon convicted in prison early 47, accused of being US agent;
Feb 52 Feb 47 placed under US jurisdiction and probably sent to USSR.
