Maurice Gardien¹, lawyer, residing at 75 rue Richelieu, Paris, was recently brought into the deal by the Union Bank of Switzerland to arrange a new ostensible destination for the ball bearings held in England. He is alleged to have offered or paid 250,000 Swiss francs to the firm Labeco (Lauter) in Stockholm, to arrange for necessary import clearances in Sweden.

- e. Cometal of 128 Boulevard Haussman, Paris, represented by Maurice Bracka, the owner of the firm Societe Getraco, 79 Champs Elysees, is attempting to take title to the goods held in England in order to obtain their release.
- f. The superintendence firm Bureau d'Etudes et de Recherches pour l'Industrie Moderne (BERIM), Paris, controlled the quality of the bearings on behalf of the Chinese buyers.
- g. Bleichroeder, Bing & Co., of London and 161 William Street, New York City, insured the shipment against all damages and loss by seizure from Schweinfurt to Rostock.
- h. The firm Roulement Geneve merely introduced Marc Block to Kugelfischer.
- i. In view of the direct negotiations between Bloch and Kugelfischer, and considering the method of payment, there is little doubt that Kugelfischer was aware of the final destination of the shipment. Bloch and Kugelfischer are anxious to ship the remainder of the order (7,000,000 Swiss francs) to Rostock.
