### THIS IS UNEVALUATED INFORMATION

The following letter, dated 2 May 1951, was sent from Boshko Boshkov, a Bulgarian refugee of the Lavrion Camp, to Ivan Dochev, leader of the Bulgarian National Front, who is residing in Austria:

"I received your letter of April 1951. I express my sorrow for its contents. You must know that my friends and I here in Greece are standing under the Bulgarian Flag of the Bulgarian Democratic Bloc, because we are near the borderline of Bulgaria and because we know who (sic) and how aid must be given to our country. You tell me that I create opposition among the refugees. You, like many others who pretend to be politicians, want to illegally take the right to represent the Bulgarian People before the New World. Who gave you this right? Who voted for you? Do you think that we do not know who you are, Dear Mr. Dochev? Were you not together with the conqueror from 1941 to 1944? Did you not depart together with the conqueror? Did you not continue from Germany under the chairmanship of Alexander Rankov? Did you not leave us alone on September 9, 1944? Was it not you and Kristo Stator who became Ministers of the Government abroad, while the whole of Bulgaria was swimming in blood? You are pro-German. So is your organ, Colonel Golovanov, here. You get annoyed, because we want to create a Democratic Bulgaria. You only think of yourselves. The Bulgarian Democratic Bloc has been recognized by the refugees and all the Bulgarian people. It has sub-committees all over Bulgaria. Those who want to become members of this (our) organization must be willing to sign the following statement:

"I, the undersigned, hereby declare before God that I want to become a member of the Bulgarian Democratic Bloc, and that I promise to fight against the Communist Reds until the liberation of my Homeland. Should I not keep my oath, etc."

"We might not write to each other again, but you must know that you are making a great mistake in having confidence in Golovanov."

"I am fighting together with the Bulgarian Democratic Bloc."
