Nikolai Dimitrov
Following is a letter dated 28 May 1951 from Nikolai Dimitrov to Ivan Dochev, leader of the Bulgarian National Front who is residing in Greece.

"We have not come in contact for two years now. I had to keep still, as the Communists were watching me. Even today they are watching me. I am waiting for the International Committee which is coming periodically for that matter. Let it be said that we will see who will be disillusioned. Our two wise liberators will remain with their finger in their mouth so that they will hear from me. I am not afraid of death's cries, but I fear the situation of the refugees. This situation is not at all favorable. Therefore as far as is here, we kept our positions organized correctly."

"As soon as Dimitrov got to know himself, he considers himself as a leader. Work cannot be done this way. During my absence, all the work we had done was dissolved by Nikolai Dobrologorov himself. He used advantages of my absence to satisfy his personal interests. He never seemed to understand that all had recognized me as their leader. During my absence, he started associating with persons with a mysterious past. He formed an organization, not entirely officially, but entirely Macedonian, of ex-NKVD members. He communicated me in the presence of official persons. Quite recently said, I do not know. Friend of ours in America wrote to us recently to protest against Dobrologorov's appointment as representative of the National Front in Greece; and this, because he is surrounded by Macedonians only."
