Memorandum for DOCHEV file

15 April 1954

In my phone conversation last night with [ ] (see memo in his file), he stated that he had received a letter from Dr. D. The following is a summary:

1. The American Consulate advised D that before he could apply for a visa he would have to extend his Canadian passport for six months. D has done this.
2. Then the consul told him he would have to have a letter from the person in the States he was going to see. D obtained the letter and was then informed that someone in the US would have to guarantee that he had enough money for use in the US and for his return to Canada. D writes [ ] that "he is taking care of this".
3. However, the consul told him when all of his documents were in order, it would take a minimum of two to three months before the visa could be issued.

I asked [ ] to send a translation, deleting names, as soon as possible to DFE at his home.
